

In Memoriam—George Barron



George was honored by the North Dakota Genealogical Society in April 2013. An excerpt from the article that appeared in the Spring 2013 NDSGS Newsletter follows.

George Barron began his career in Jamestown ND as a science and chemistry teacher for Jamestown Public

High School for 36 years beginning in the fall of 1951. He had previously taught for one year at Cleveland, ND. George retired from teaching in 1986. In approximately 1988 at the request of his daughter, George started helping her with their family's history project. That was all it took, George was "hooked."

George's first genealogical projects compiled and published included: The Berner Book – for a mini reunion of the cousins of his wife, Jewel. Each family was given a copy at the reunion. In addition George created a self guided tour of family sites in the Jamestown and rural area for the cousins during the weekend reunion in 1994; The Barron Family from Banffshire, Scotland to Moody County, Dakota Territory, USA Book in 1995 with his cousin Norma Johnson of New Mexico. This book details their two lines of the Barron clan. Their book won 1st Prize at the Family History Workshop in Moorhead, MN.

George belonged to the James River Genealogy Club since his conception in 1991 in Carrington, ND. He began doing searching for Stutsman County in 1991.

His summer projects included reading tombstones in cemeteries of Stutsman County Supplement 1 in 1991 and Supplement 2 in 1992 aided by his wife, Jewel, and their "cemetery" Golden Retriever dog. Various cemeteries in Logan County and Kidder County in 1996; Foster County-1997; Sheridan County and Eddy County-1998; did field work on revision of Cemeteries of ND Wells County-1986-1998; Rural and Village Cemeteries of Stutsman County-1999; Most Cemeteries of Jamestown, Stutsman County-2000; Morton County cemeteries, 2001, Rural and Village Cemeteries in Barnes County-2002; Cemeteries of Valley City-Barnes County-2003; Sioux County cemeteries-2004; Northern and Southern LaMoure County cemeteries in 2005; Highland Home Cemetery of Jamestown ND along with Griggs County cemeteries in 2007. He was aided by his

traveling cemetery buddy, Daphne Drewello, of Jamestown and his ever faithful cemetery Golden Retriever. Together they traveled thousands of miles, read thousands of tombstones and collected thousands of records to aid in getting the most correct information. Following the collection process, George created books for each of these cemeteries which can still be obtained today through a donation to the James River Genealogy Club.

George's winter projects included creating many indexes and creating a book for each project along with data bases that he maintains on a daily or annually basis: Obituary index to Stutsman County Record, 1930-1941 and 1942 to January 1961 (closing); Newspaper Obituary Indexes for Cleveland, ND 1914-1925, Courtenay 1901-1922, Kensal 1903-1942, Medina 1905-1920 & 1929-1934, Montpelier 1914-1934, Pingree 1908-1930, Streeter 1908-1930, Woodworth 1912-1935.

Published Marriage Indexes – Stutsman County records 1884-1975, Stutsman County records 1975-2002, pre 1925 marriage index on Stutsman County is on the internet at usgenweb.org

- Graduates of Stutsman County through 1925, 2003
- Early Death Registers of Stutsman County 1893-1943, 2001
- All Stutsman County Burial Permits in existence, 2004
- Published Jamestown, (ND) Area Photos, 2009 (abt 1500 entries)
- Murders, shooting, killings, suicides & general unusual deaths – on 3rd book (currently 6,000 entries gleamed from newspapers)
- Graduates of Stutsman County Schools, 1926-1935, 2010
- Indexes to Stutsman County School Census 1901-1941 (many volumes), 1943, 1945, 1947, 1949, and 1951.

This article falls far short of listing all of the contribution George Barron has made to genealogy buffs searching for information on their ancestors in Stutsman County and its area.

Visualizing the Chronicling America Newspaper Search Results

Chronicling America is a great way to view historic newspapers from 1789-1925 for free. It is located at http://chroniclingamerica.loc.gov/. Now there is a unique way to search their newspapers.

The Georgia Tech Research Institute partnered with eHistory at the University of Georgia to create a search portal that displays the results on a map along with a frequency graph.

Enter a search term and the resultant articles are

displayed on a map along with a timeline. The brighter dots have more results, clicking on the dots displays the newspapers and issue dates and provides the option to view a pdf of the article or view it on the Chronicling America website.

We are going to try something different for this column. Send in your genealogical questions to see if we can answer them. We may ask for help from our members or the various repositories in North Dakota. Questions should relate to North Dakota research.

Answer for the summer newsletter question.

How would you find the street address of St. John's Episcopal Church of Dickinson, ND in 1898?

Look at the Sanborn digital maps on the library of Congress website for Dickinson in 1898, image 2. Address 623 Sims. Actually only says Episcopal Church.

Citation Corner

If you can't find a death record where else might you locate the information given in a death record? Funeral Home records, cemetery records, church records and family sources all need to be researched for this information.

I have an interesting record for one of my great aunts who died in 1914. The Tekamah Mortuary Record included the following information. Frances Fittro, residence, Tekamah. Cause of Death: Cancer. Died: September 15, 1914. Buried: September 16, 1914. Age: 46y 6m 25d. Place of burial: Tekamah Cemetery.

This was the abstracted record. I was unable to find the original Tekamah Mortuary Record. I was also unable to find a death certificate or an obituary so I was pleased to

find this. It actually gives quite a bit of information.

The source citation would contain the following pieces of information: place of record, type of record, date, where the record was from and the person's name.

So the source citation would look something like this. Burt County Museum (Tekamah, Nebraska) to Patrice Hartman, copy, 2008, providing Tekamah Mortuary Record for Frances Fittro, Tekamah Cemetery.

Remember to search the local area museums and historical societies, libraries or perhaps even the state level historical societies and museums as they may hold some of these treasures.
