

Kahler Glen Winter Rules for Renters, Residents and Guests

Groomed Ski Trails vs Snowshoe Paths vs Shared Use Paths (wider than the snowshoe paths)

- Do not walk, pull sleds, sled, walk dogs or snowshoe on trails groomed for cross-country skiing. This includes both the grooved tracks and the area for skate skiers in the middle. Divots in trails can cause dangerous conditions for skiers, especially on downhill runs. Kahler Glen home owners pay for the trails to be groomed at Kahler Glen. If you want to make a donation to help out more, please buy a Sno-park Pass or donate at the Kiosk available at the State Park.
- Please use the shared use/snowshoe paths made by volunteers, to travel to the sledding hill or other areas at Kahler Glen.
- Please only cross the groomed ski trail where it is marked to cross. Look for skiers and wait until they have passed, then step lightly across this intersection.
- No parking is allowed on residential streets or at the Clubhouse/Wildflour area or the Athletic Club (Closed due to COVID-19) at any time. All public users of the ski or snowshoe trails must park in the designated Sno-park lots and have a valid Sno-park permit displayed. Residents, their guest or renters need to park on their own property/driveways. If you have more cars than you can park at your residence, as often happens with the Natapoc townhomes, please get in touch with our General Manager, Dave Millard to get a parking pass, so they can park in the Sno-park lot and not get ticketed.

Sledding

- Sledding is only for Kahler Glen residents and their guests and renters.
- Sledding is not allowed on any roads or the groomed ski trails or areas that are roped off or say “no sledding”.
- There is NO PUBLIC sledding at Kahler Glen. The best sledding for the Public is at Lake Wenatchee State Park.
- **There is no parking on residential streets, please use the shared use paths to walk to the sledding hill.**
- Please take all items home with you, do not leave broken sleds or garbage.

Ice Skating • DUE TO COVID-19 there will be NO ICE SKATING this Winter

- Warning: With a blanket of snow over a pond, the ice is insulated and is thinner, so please stay off, the golf course ponds.
