The couple wanted to give a nod to the traditional elements, materials and architectural shapes of Greece, while also giving it a contemporary twist. "We know it's not our forever place, so we wanted it to have a modern element so when we eventually sell it, someone else can come in and put their stamp on it as well."

design it

As Alexandra and Nik had never owned a place - let alone renovated one - they sought the help of Damaris Oprescu from Lucchini Oprescu Interiors to guide them through some ideas. "Damaris helped us envision what it would be like living there, and how everything would flow," says Alexandra. "We ended up extending the laundry, main ensuite and walk-in wardrobe, and minimising the large fover, which was slightly wasted space. This meant we could have a double sink in the ensuite, add a bench in the shower, and have a really functional walk-in wardrobe."

Design-wise, there were a couple of things the couple were set on: "I really wanted a statement marble on the kitchen island," says Alexandra. "Damaris came up with the great idea of having this in elements throughout the rest of the apartment, too. I also loved the idea of having curved banquette seating for entertaining, which we could turn into a feature."
