September 14 Horse Show Highlights



Sunday, September 14th dawned with a foggy, cool, and humid 56 degrees. By 9:15am the fog burned off to reveal a partly sunny day with increasing dust as the horses, riders, and drivers went through their paces in the two rings at Felton Field. Fortunately, the dust (due to moderate to severe drought

conditions throughout Massachusetts) wasn't terrible until much later in the day, and as the temperature climbed to the 70s, the judges declared that jackets were optional for the 40+ riders and drivers who joined a few dozen spectators.

Our show secretary, Jill Poulin, expertly and efficiently ran all classes and divisions. Most of the riding classes were completed just after 1pm when the drivers took over the field. This year's September 2025 show attracted several young riders who were new to cantering and enjoyed showing off their hard work. A number of new green horses (horses new to competitions) competed in that eponymous division at this show. We also noted that a large number of the riders in this show had not participated in previous shows this year, so we were happy to welcome new faces and see the excitement that the show brought to young riders and adult riders as well. We







had fewer drivers entering this fall show, likely due to competing shows in other areas.

Horse Show Series
presents our community

enjoyment of the sport. Participants and spectators were treated to authentic equestrian enthusiasm and pride. Familiar faces and new friends participated in more than 60 classes in 15 divisions.



Horse Rescue in the News

Recently, Martha Stewart adopted two Friesian horses from Dorset Equine Rescue in Vermont. Stewart owns a 150+ acre spread in Kantonah, New York and occasionally takes in rescue animals. Three-year-old Ulysses and ten-year-old Stewart join a small menagerie of pets and farm animals. Stewart plans on lavishing them with care and attention until they can be properly re-homed.
