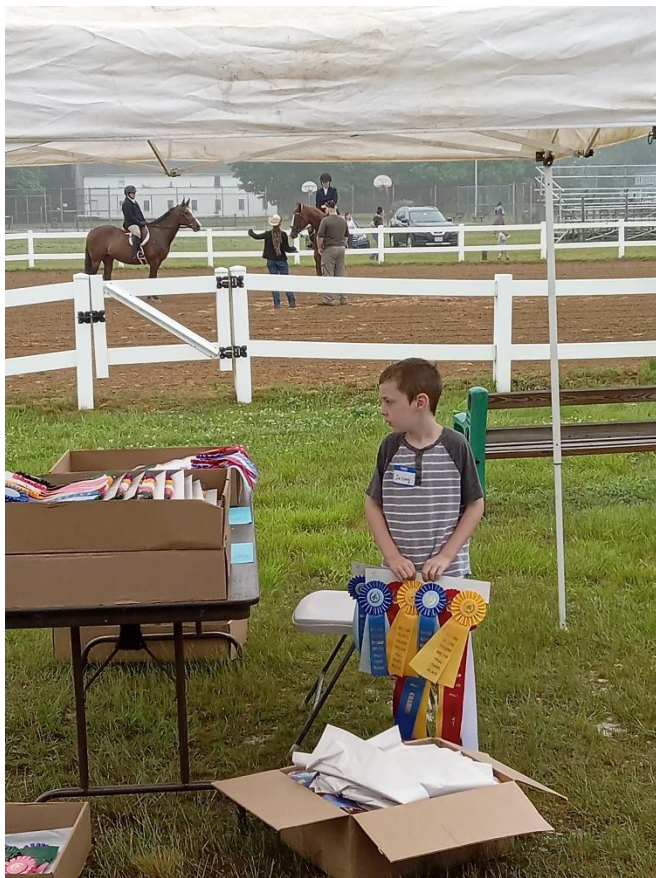

History Spotlight – BRDC Roots – 1960s – Part 3

Continuing to lean on the "History of the Barre Riding and Driving Club" speech given before the club's birthday buffet on August 7th, 1970, and doing additional research through newspapers.com, we carry on with the saga of BRDC in the 1960s.

32 Events Planned for Next Sunday's Barre Horse Show

The theme of the oldest horse show in Worcester County this year is youth.

Of 32 events in the 19th annual Barre's Horse Show, to be held at Felton Field, Barre, next Sunday, eight events are limited to exhibitors under 18 years old. Also for the first time there will be a class for 4-H Club members only.

In addition to the junior classes, there will be jumper, hunter, palomino, saddle horse, Morgan and pleasure horse divisions open to exhibitors of all ages.

Point winners are eligible for the New England Championships, since the Barre Show is recognized by the New England Horsemen's Council.

Judges will be W. Dayton Sumner of Haddonfield, N. J., and Howard A. Putnam, Springfield. Leonard Almy will be the announcer. Ringmasters will be veterans Clarence Hutchinson and Ralph Robbins.

Admission is \$1 for adults and 50 cents for children. Parking is free.

Entry fees for certain events will be donated to the Olympic Fund and the New England Horsemen's Council. There are no entry fees for 4-H classes.

Boston Globe June 10, 1956

In 1965, the Club voted to change the manner of electing the board of Directors who then elected the President to the usual procedure of a Nominating Committee presenting a slate of officers at the Annual Meeting in January. The Club voted to run a professionally managed Class B horse show with Stuart Holbrook as manager. This arrangement only lasted a couple of years as the cost of this type of show proved beyond the means of the Club and was discontinued after 1966. The regional show, which ran for 29 years and drew horsemen and horsewomen from all across New England was a widely-known event as evidenced by the article from the Boston Globe dated June 10, 1956.

Barre Horse Show To Be Discontinued

The Barre Riding and Driving Club horse show, which has been given at Felton Field for 29 years attracting horsemen from all parts of New England, will be discontinued.

The club voted at least temporarily to cut out the large scale horse show, at the annual meeting held last week, at which Mrs. Helen Connington was elected president.

Mrs. Connington said the Riding and Driving Club would direct its efforts toward the junior horse show, competitive trail rides and educational clinics. The ever increasing high costs of large scale horse shows was given as the reason to forego the annual event.

The scholarship of \$150 awarded yearly to Barre students interested in horsemanship was increased to \$200.

Elected with Mrs. Connington, were Richard Goldsmith and Virginia Herrick, vice presidents; Margaret Sawtell, secretary; Louise Herrick, recording secretary; Charles Connington, treasurer; Joseph O. Sawtell, assistant treasurer and Herbert A. Rice, historian.

2. Entry fee will be \$5.00 which includes a picnic lunch for riders. ENTRY FEE MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRY and should be sent to:

Barre, Massachusetts
3. Cancellations received after May 7 will result in forfeiture of entry fee, except in case of family tragedy or injury to rider.
4. Horses must be 13.2 hands or over to be eligible.
5. The ride will be judged 30% on time and 70% on condition and performance of the horse. To qualify, the contestant must finish the ride in less than 45 minutes. No points will be assessed against riders finishing in the elapsed time of 45 minutes to 1 hour & 15 minutes. Two Points will be deducted for each minute that the contestant finishes before or after these limits.
6. The Committee reserves the right to decline any entry and to return the entry fee before the start of the ride.
7. Numbers and starting positions will be assigned as entries are received.
8. The Committee will not be responsible for any accident which may occur to any horse, rider or vehicle in connection with the ride.

STALLS: A few permanent stalls are available at a charge of \$2.00 each. Horses may arrive Friday P.M. and remain until Sunday noon. Stalls are limited and will be reserved in order of receipt of entries.

PLACINGS: A trophy and five ribbons will be awarded in each of the following divisions:
Men
Women
Juniors (18 years and under).
Open

This ride is recognized as a qualifying ride for Morgan Trail Horse Classes

The idea of a Competitive Trail Ride was first brought up by Charles Hammann early in 1965 to investigate and report back later. At the May 15th meeting, the Club voted to run this activity, with Charles Hammann as chairman. The first Competitive Trail Ride was a huge success, realizing a profit of about \$70 with Becky Spinney taking top honors in the Open and Junior Divisions. The Club continued its support of the US Equestrian Team, voting to donate \$25 that year. The Club also continued to donate small amounts of money to local youth activities and of course continued to offer scholarships. In 1966, the Club voted to raise the scholarship amount to \$200 and to focus on the Junior Horse Show as described in the article from the

Athol Daily News dated August 9, 1966. Notably there were gymkhana-style classes such as costume, obstacle course, and egg and spoon classes in the Junior Show.

The Club ran another successful 35-Mile Competitive Trail Ride in May 1966 (see entry form photo) with Charles Hammann at the helm and again Becky Spinney won top honors in both the Open and Junior Division receiving the Lady Alice Trophy for a year until the following year when Sherry Stevens won both Open and Junior Divisions and kept the trophy for that year. In May of 1966 Mrs. Herrick reported on the Jennie Blaisdell Ring at the 4-H Camp in Spencer. The Club voted \$50 for this project and also voted for Attorney Cranston to take charge of filing our by-laws and constitution as a non-profit organization. Ann Kelley and Joyce Keddy received the Jennie Blaisdell Scholarships of \$200 apiece.

In 1967, the Club reaffirmed the previous vote that the Lady Alice Trophy was to be awarded to the same *horse* not the rider to be won three times for permanent possession. Recall that the Lady Alice Trophy was apparently named after an award-winning Saddlebred mare who competed all over New England. A policy of holding Trail Rides & Shows as scheduled was adopted since it was nearly impossible to cancel at a late date and not inconvenience some participant or exhibitor. The Club decided that horsemen and horsewomen were a hardy lot and could put up with all types of weather. At the first meeting of the year, heavy sleds drawn by the Allen heavy teams entertained the members and the following March, Mabel Owen gave a very well received illustrated talk on "More About Horses" the proceeds going to the

Horse Show August 20 In Barre

A junior horse show will be held Aug. 20 at 10 a.m. at Felton Field in Barre, sponsored by the Barre Riding and Driving Club, Inc. The show will be held rain or shine and proceeds will go to the Jennie B. Blaisdell Scholarship Fund.

In Ring 1 will be classes: 4-H fitting and showing (English); bareback equitation (English); model western horse; lead line (six years and under); senior western equitation; obstacle race; senior English equitation; barrel race; open reg. Morgan pleasure; road hack; open pleasure driving (2 or 4 wheel vehicle - horse or pony).

In the afternoon in ring 1: costume (humorous, pretty, original); western trail; open stock horse; pair class; English trail; oldsters (over 21 - humorous); command western; command English; Lawrence V. Rice Perpetual Memorial Trophy open pleasure; family class and egg and spoon.

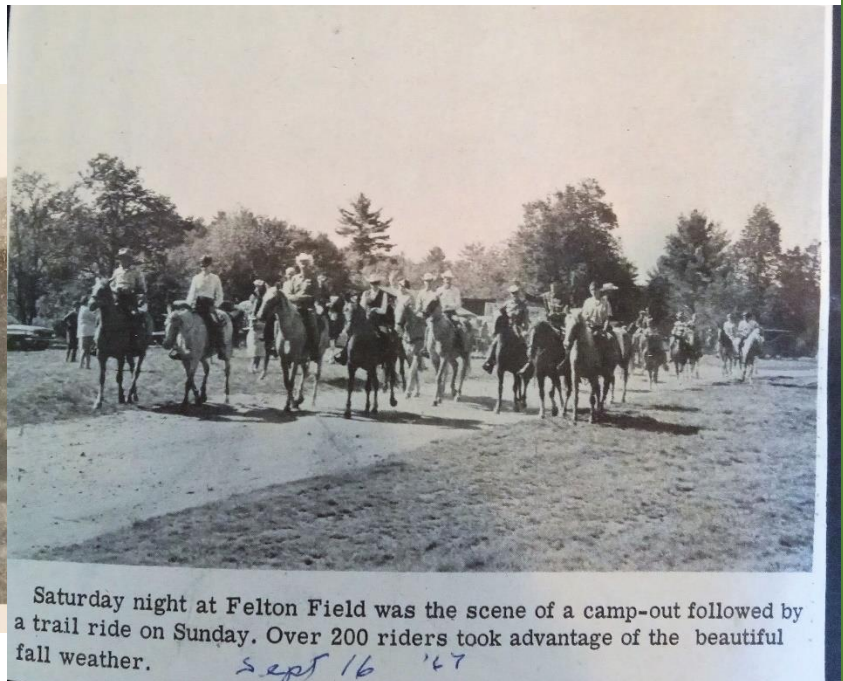
In Ring 2 morning classes will be: 4-H fitting and showing (western); bareback equitation (western); model English horse; junior English equitation; pet pony; junior western equitation; NECT stock seat equitation; open reg. Pinto pleasure.

Afternoon events in Ring 2: horse jumping; pony jumping; western pleasure and English pleasure.

Athol Daily News August 9, 1966

USET. A congratulatory letter was sent to the newly organized Laurelwood Club in the Spencer-Paxton area and another letter was sent to Representative Wetmore regarding the Club's opposition to the banning of all curb bits legislation then pending. Sherry Stevens took top honors in the Open and Junior Divisions in the 35-Mile Ride, keeping the Lady Alice Trophy in Barre for another year. The first Riding Club clinic was held at Felton Field with about 20 participants. The Club received an invitation from the Western Riders to assist and participate in their 1st 2-day Trail Ride, with Felton Field as their base of operations. Many local riders and club members had participated annually in these rides, a most enjoyable co-sponsored event. The Club refused any financial take and expressed that their share go into the Western Rider's Building Fund.

The Junior Show date was changed to a Sunday, which really paid off to the tune of \$955.63 that year. The first Driving Event was held the first week in November with several drivers. Rain dampened the equipment but not the spirit. The Lawrence V. Rice Trophy at the Junior Show was won in 1966 and 1967 by Cynthia Hargreaves of North Brookfield. Mark Morehead and Paul Flagg won the two now \$250 Jennie Blaisdell Scholarships. The Fall Trail Ride in 1967 was extremely well attended with more than 200 riders hitting the trails on that beautiful fall day. We can only imagine the horror DCR would experience if the Club raised that number of riders today! A couple of candid snapshots give a view into the style of camping 50 years ago.



Saturday night at Felton Field was the scene of a camp-out followed by a trail ride on Sunday. Over 200 riders took advantage of the beautiful fall weather.
