2023 Cabin Fever Night & Annual Meeting March 18



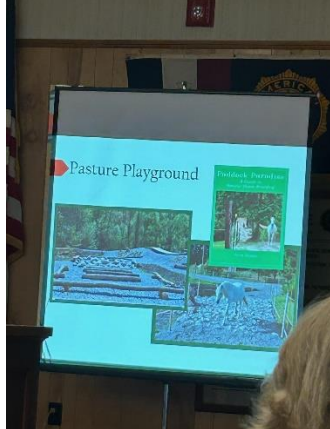
The fun evening at American Legion Post #2 in Barre included a presentation, a trivia-based raffle, and way too much tasty potluck food!

BRDC President, Lynne Goodnow, presided over our annual meeting, providing updates on our new website, upcoming events, and our current, solid financial state, as well as the election of our 2023 Board of Officers and Directors. Thanks to Lynne and the board members for their time and efforts to support our club!

After dinner, we all enjoyed an engaging and fact-filled presentation by **Renee Gregiore from Equidoc on Getting Your Horse in Shape for Spring & Summer Riding.**

Renee touched on three main themes: horse fitness, rider fitness, and tack fitness. Horse fitness advice included working on varied terrain, ramping up time, and increasing speed last. Plan ahead because it can take up to 6 weeks to get your horse in shape. Not only that, but if you slack off, all of your hard work can be undone in just 2 weeks! Tip: aim for 2-3 times per week sessions. Even a 10- or 15-minute walking session 2 times per week can keep your



horse on track. Renee emphasized that horses walking around in a paddock all day is NOT the equivalent of a steady-paced in-hand walk. So, get out those halters and leads and get walking! One take-away for rider fitness was a tip to lie down on your stomach for 5 minutes a day to stretch, de-tension, and strengthen your glutes and lower back. Often overlooked as part of core strength, this tip can keep you from being either a stiff "tin man" or a floppy "scare crow" on your horse's back. Renee also mentioned tack fitness, with the analogy of trying to hike in ill-fitting boots by compensating with top quality socks. Forget that fancy saddle pad and ensure that your saddle fits your horse. Check out adjustable saddles just now coming on the market. Renee shared many other tips from how to go about creating a training schedule tailored to you and your horse, what to work on first, second, and last, to recommendations on how to keep your horse mentally and physically fit by creating a stimulating pasture environment. She even provided some helpful information about roughage, including hay pellets and nibble nets. We can't thank Renee enough for sharing her thoughtful expertise with us!

The evening finale was a trivia-based raffle, testing equine tidbits across the board. Many attendees took home prizes from tack, apparel, and supplies to free memberships, event discounts, and gift cards and baskets. Many thanks to all who attended! See you out on the trails or at our clinics, shows, and other events this year!

Using state-of-the-art computerized equipment, Brenda and her crew are busy customizing boxfuls of apparel for customers throughout New England. From tee shirts to jackets, and even vinyl signs, they bring smiles and identity to sports teams, corporations, and individuals. Just over 30 years ago a degree in Visual Communications from the University of Delaware and Brenda's love of embroidery collided, and 1st String, Inc. was born. Now she creates logos and converts them into computer programs that automatically operate multi-colored embroidering machines, four color silk-screen printers, and cloth and vinyl cutters. "I call it my pizza oven," she says of her massive, shiny-red, conveyor-belt ink curing oven. Judging from the response our BRDC members have upon viewing her results, her efforts are well worth it.

Calling All American Quarter Horse Owners! by Kat Marsh



If you own, or know someone who owns, an **American Quarter Horse**, here's your chance to contribute to valuable research about the breed and about horse behaviors in general. Temple

Grandin (Chicago State U) and Paul McGreevy (UNE Australia) have teamed up to investigate the genetic basis for common horse behaviors and you can help them through their citizen science project. I met Temple Grandin back in the early 2000s at an autism conference in Chicago. Grandin, who was born in Boston and raised in New England, provided me with great insights and ways to support my autistic spectrum students. She is a brilliant thinker who pioneered safer and more humane ways to handle livestock before and during the slaughtering process. She is an advocate for deeper understandings of animal behaviors through research.

So, how can you help? Grandin and McGreevy believe that a horse's genetic makeup can help predict horse behaviors, which will provide horse breeders with information to improve horse performance and overall animal welfare. If you would like to participate in this Fulbright-grant study, please visit <https://www.e-barq.org/> to complete the Equine Behavioral Assessment and Research Questionnaire, which has been adapted from a similar questionnaire used to study canine behaviors. The E-BARQ has already provided important information on equine behavior such as behaviors in aging horses, in-hand behaviors that predict dangerous in-saddle behaviors, and even how horses behave differently when handled by men vs. women. The future of improved equine-human relations could be in your hands!

Blue Ribbon Volunteering at the June 18 Horse Show!

Liability waiver form must be signed before riding.



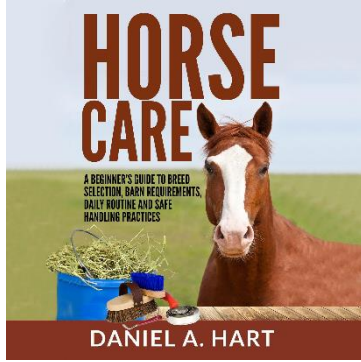

Book Corner



Looking for a basic horse care book? **Horse Care by Daniel A. Hart** is a worthwhile option. Just \$6 for the Kindle version, which you can read

on your laptop, tablet, or phone, Hart takes you through the pros and cons of common breeds, equipment, feeding, housing, grooming, handling, and health care. The subtitle indicates “beginner’s guide”, but the reality is that many horse-owners would benefit from Hart’s gentle, common-sense approach, and practical, no-nonsense information. Even if you have solid experience with horse care, it's great to have a handy resource that is written in a plain and accessible style, full of to-the-point advice to refer back to again and again to refresh or build on skills. While some of the info is fairly generalized such as selecting housing for your horse, or reviewing necessary equipment for riding and care, it is more than made up for in the sections on budgeting, grooming, handling, and health care. Hart provides a thorough budget for keeping a horse. Although some specific details may change (cost of full or rough board for your local area), the budget will help with perspective, which is especially useful to those of us who tend toward starry-eyed optimism as we prepare our monthly budgets. Hart blends just the right amount of frank and helpful information with a deep admiration for the horse and for the horse-human bond that draws most of us to want to work with and improve our expertise in caring for and bonding with these unique animals.

AWARDED BY THE BARRE RIDING AND DRIVING CLUB, INC.

1. ELIGIBILITY:

Any person now enrolled in a program of higher education or applying for such enrollment is eligible. Equal opportunity will be given to all applicants without regard to sex, age, race, national origin, or religion.

Preference of scholarship aid will be given in the following order:

- b. To sons/daughters, grandsons/granddaughters of active Barre Riding and Driving Club members.
- c. Students with interest/hobbies involving animals or related higher education.
- d. Town of Barre residents.

PARTICIPANT'S RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY
ASSUMPTION OF RISK AND INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

BY SIGNING THIS AGREEMENT, YOU ARE GIVING UP CERTAIN LEGAL RIGHTS INCLUDING THE RIGHT TO RECOVER DAMAGES IN CASE OF INJURY, DEATH OR PROPERTY DAMAGES. READ THIS AGREEMENT CAREFULLY BEFORE SIGNING IT. YOUR SIGNATURE INDICATES YOUR UNDERSTANDING OF AND AGREEMENT TO ITS TERMS.

In consideration of my being provided equine activities and allowed access and use, today and on all future dates of the property, facilities and services for equine and other activities owned and managed by the Town of Barre and the Barre Riding and Driving Club, (hereinafter collectively referred to as MANAGER), the Rider, his heirs, assigns, and legal representatives, hereby expressly agrees to the following:

1. I agree to assume ANY AND ALL RISKS INVOLVED IN OR ARISING FROM MY USE OF OR PRESENCE UPON MANAGER'S PROPERTY AND/OR FACILITIES and to hold Manager and all of its successors, assigns, subsidiaries, affiliates, officers, directors, employees and agents completely harmless and not liable and release them from all liability whatsoever and I AGREE NOT TO SUE them on account of or in connection with any claims, causes of action, injuries, damages, cost or expenses arising out of my use of or presence upon Manager's property and facilities, including without limitation bodily injury, property damage, the risks of death, including consequential damages, falls, kicks, bites, collisions with vehicles, horses or stationary objects, fire or explosion, the unavailability of emergency medical care, or the negligence or deliberate act of another person. It is my responsibility and/or the owner of the horse's responsibility to carry full and complete liability insurance coverage on horse, personal property and himself. I agree to indemnify and defend Manager and all of its successors, assigns, subsidiaries, affiliates, officers, directors, employees and agents against, and hold it harmless from, any and all claims, causes of action, damages, judgments, costs or expenses, including attorney's fees, which in any way arise from my use of or presence upon the Manager's property and facilities. I agree to pay reasonable attorneys and expenses incurred by any and all persons benefiting from this document incurred in defending any action I bring against them in violation hereof.
2. I certify that I am fully capable of participating in this activity; therefore, I assume full responsibility for myself, including my minor children, for bodily injury, death and loss of personal property and expenses thereof as a result of those inherent risks and dangers and my negligence in participating in this activity.
3. I agree to abide by all of Manager's rules and regulations. Manger, its management staff, employees, instructors and trail masters reserve the right, at their sole and absolute discretion: (1) to cancel any event or make alterations in the itinerary as they deem necessary and/or appropriate; (2) to refuse to accept or retain any person for participation in any ride; and (3) terminate the participation of any person and any program who does not appear capable of handling the program without danger to the horse or other persons. This activity entails risks of injury to participants and a risk of injury to spectators or third parties.
4. If I am using my horse, the horse shall be free from infection, contagious or transmissible disease. Manager reserves the right to refuse horse if not in proper health or is deemed dangerous or undesirable. I must present a negative coggins upon every entrance upon Manager's land.
5. **USE OF HELMET.** It is mandatory that all riders under the age of 18 MUST wear a helmet and it is recommended that all other riders wear a helmet. I assume all helmet-related risks, including, but not limited to, the risk of injury if I don't wear a riding helmet.
6. I agree that I am riding at my own risk. I understand that horseback riding can involve being in remote areas for extended periods of time, far from communication, transportation and medical facilities. That these areas may have natural hazards which management cannot anticipate, eliminate, modify, or control, and accidents can happen to anyone at any time. Some activities may involve dangers which arise from a great variety of terrain and conditions including steep ascent, meadows, winding forest paths, obstacles, change of terrain and surface on short notice, water, swamp, presence of other animals and the like. Certain risks cannot be eliminated without destroying the unique character of this activity.

Initials

The same elements that contribute to the unique character of this activity can cause loss or damage of equipment, accidental injury or illness, or, in extreme cases, permanent trauma or death. In all instances, I am responsible for applying common sense.

7. This release and agreement applies not only to present claims but also to future claims and future equine activities, unless and until it is revoked in writing. A revocation applies only to claims that accrue after the date of revocation from incidents that occur after the date of revocation. I understand that I am not allowed to enter any land of any person unless this document is in full force and effect without alteration, amendment or change. No person has the authority to alter, amend, or change the provisions of this document insofar as they benefit or might benefit the released person.

If a guardian of a person lacking legal capacity to contract sign this document, the signing person represents and warrants that he has the legal authority to bind the person on whose behalf he signs.

This document is executed as the entire agreement of the undersigned as to the subject matter hereof under Massachusetts law as a sealed instrument.

WARNING

Under Massachusetts law, an equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or the death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities, pursuant to section 2D of chapter 128 of the General Laws.
