BEHIND THE EYES OF DORIAN GRAY

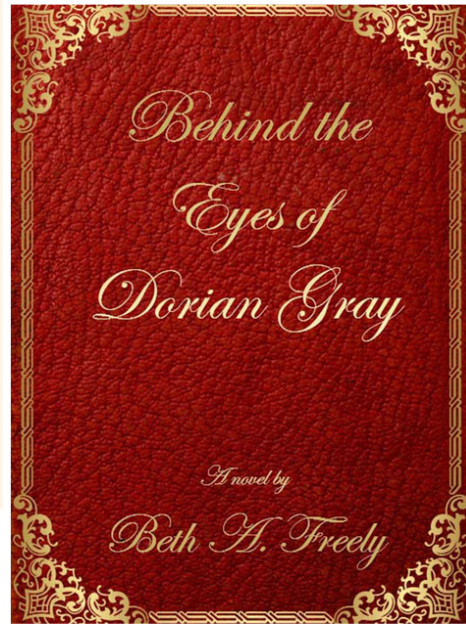
Rachael relaxed slightly, her hand resting on his shoulder. "She's a powerful witch, if you can believe everything that is said about her."

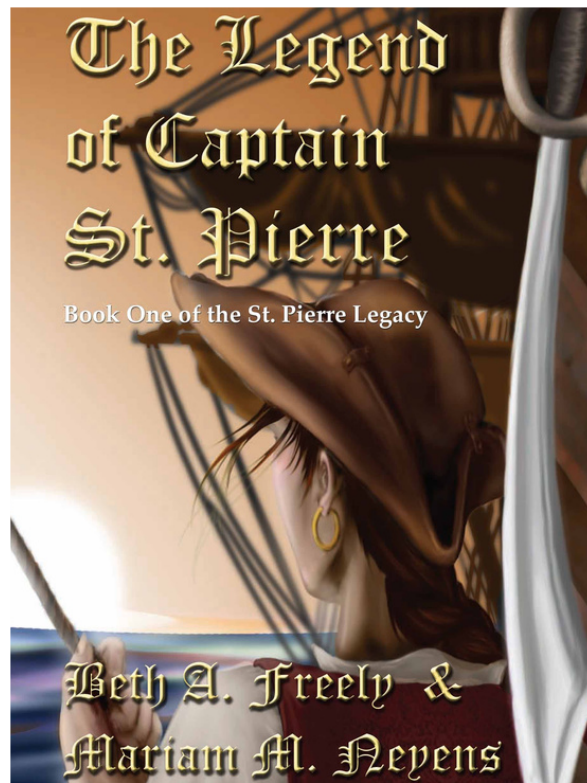

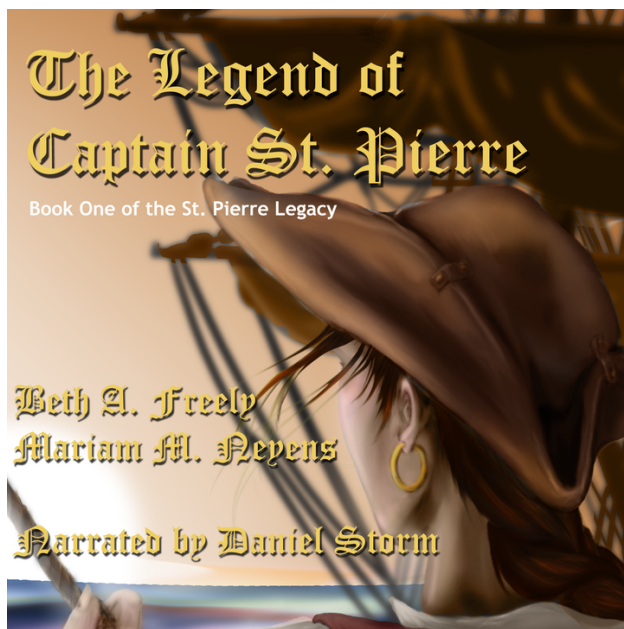
THE LEGEND OF CAPTAIN ST. PIERRE
