

2018 Harbor Happenings: Year in Review

Winona

- The Winona location served 5 teens and 8 parents
- Community service projects included working with rescue animals, ushering for the Winona Hims concert, writing letters to cancer patients, neighbors, and soldiers, picking up trash in local parks, visiting nursing homes, making treats for neighbors, serving at a soup kitchen, heading the Alliance for Substance Abuse Prevention booth, and sorting clothing at a local non-profit
- Activities included attending the Minnesota Marine Art Museum, community creative and cultural events, Christian concerts and church events, and the Tabernacle Experience in Albert Lea
- Additional activities include weekly church and chapel, movie nights, fitness, outdoor activity, family meals, game nights, bible study and more
- A workshop was offered to the public "Understanding and Applying Research on Adverse Childhood Experiences" at SMU given by Victor Vieth
- Staff were trained in boundaries, trauma informed care, Love & Logic and simulcast the Empowered to Connect Conference
- Events hosted to increase ministry awareness, raise funds, and establish relationships included the Donut Run, Driven to Give, and Celebration of Hope
- Hope Harbor was chosen as a recipient of proceeds for September's Winona Hims Concert



Marshall

- The Marshall location served 10 teens and 18 parents
- Community service projects included manicures and games at an assisted living center, serving at a soup kitchen, helping with Operation Christmas Child, making bags for The Refuge homeless shelter, walking dogs, and more
- School highlights included teaching the Dave Ramsey Generation Change curriculum and various culture talks with SMSU international college students from Nepal and Mongolia
- Activities included monthly chapel at True Light Christian School, Lyon County Historical Museum, the Fagen Fighters WWII museum, Pipestone National Monument, and the Bramble Zoo and a joint field trip with Winona to the Tabernacle Experience
- Additional activities include weekly church and chapel, movie nights, fitness, outdoor activity, family meals, game nights, bible study and more
- Lifeboat Series monthly teachings launched for the Marshall community
- Seventy-three women joined the third season of Women of Hope
- Events hosted included Blessings in Boots, Treats & Testimonies, Celebration of Hope and the Hope Harbor Holiday Open House and Tour
