Whether through sharing a meal, volunteering your time, or simply reaching out to someone in need, autumn inspires us to live out our faith in practical, compassionate ways.


Consider:

B. Review of Council Minutes

Reviewed and approved minutes from April 29, May 27, June 24 and July 27 special meeting. Rhonda moved and Ellen seconded.

C. Review and of Reports

- Treasurer's Report
- Leadership Report
 - a. Rui-Xi has been hired as our new Music Director.
 - b. Sunday School will start on September 7.
 - c. God's Work, Our Hands Day of Service will be on September 7.
 - d. 1st Place Community Center continues to meet on the second Wednesday of the month.

D. Old Business

- Council approved purchasing Powerchurch as the new software for our accounting. It would take effect on January 1, 2026. This costs \$455/year.
- Projects for Service Sunday were selected.
- The bill for the trimming of the Courtyard trees has been settled.
- The LSS-MOU Agreement has been received, signed and sent to Pastor on July 10.

E. New Business

- Luis Orozco has volunteered to be our Property Manager regarding repairs.
- Repair for Concordia Charter Schools A/C cost \$16,000. First is responsible for \$8,000 of this bill. Will be an ongoing Council discussion about where to pull funds to pay this.
- Pastor David's (DEM) team has submitted its Ministry Site Review. Council will set a special meeting to review and plan how to implement this.
- Grants. Council will set a special meeting to determine possible grants, and our needs.
- Council reviewed request to place a back up air conditioner in the Food Bank to prevent loss of food due to interruption of A/C during summer months. May also be able to cool LSS offices. Will be an on-going discussion.

Called by God, Blessed to Serve (Year 4, 2025-2026)

The stories of the Year 4 Narrative Lectionary tell of God's invitation into relationship given to all people, and the ways in which God provides gifts of grace at every turn. While Abraham seemed too old to father a nation. Moses too guiet to lead a people, and David too young to take over Israel, we see throughout the Old Testament that God repeatedly calls the unexpected to step out in faith. As the people answer God's call, God never fails to equip them for the journey. Throughout Scripture, gifts of grace are given to those answering God's call, especially at some of the most trying moments. From gifts of manna in the wilderness to the promise of new life for the struggling Israelites, God's call to discipleship is never without God's blessing and provision each step of the way. As God chooses to dwell among us in Jesus Christ, God's commitment to relationship is distinctly clear. Jesus' invitations to abundant life reveal a relentless love that desires that all people know and serve God. His teachings reveal a kingdom that opposes traditional expectations of power and importance, always calling the least expected into God's mission of redemption. As the hope of the resurrection spreads, God's grace abounds in everyday moments and throughout the significant challenges of the early church. These early churches learn to rejoice, even in trials, always trusting in God's provision. Each of us are invited into a life of discipleship by our loving Creator. God's continued presence and abounding grace allows us to answer God's call, and through those blessings, to live in hope as we serve Jesus through our neighbor.

God Provides Blessings (Pentecost: Sept. 7 to Oct. 5, 2025)

God created humans to be in relationship with their Creator and blessed them with all they would need. Desiring the best for us, God regularly calls us back into relationship and invites imperfect people to be part of God's beautiful story of redemption. This relationship with God requires trust, and often challenges us to step out in this trust. Abraham, as well as Moses and the Israelites, were called to leave all they knew and trust in God's provision. Yet, when God calls, God also provides all that is needed to live faithfully as a blessing to others.

Called by God (Pentecost: Oct. 12 to Nov. 2, 2025)

God's call is often surprising to us, as God looks not on the outside, but at the heart. God continues to invite unlikely people to be great leaders and pillars of the faith. These imperfect leaders answer God's call, allowing God to work through them in remarkable ways, even as their faults are sometimes evident.

God's presence serves as a constant source of strength and peace and equips them to serve, though challenges may abound.

Promises of Hope (Pentecost: Nov. 9 to Nov. 23, 2025)

As the Israelites turn away from God and forget their calling to serve as a blessing to all nations, the prophets call them back to relationship with their creator. The prophets offer promises of hope to a people lost and dejected, reminding them that God will never abandon them and promises a future filled with hope. The people may have turned from God, but God will not turn away from them. God's plan for their future, and ours, is bright and filled with hope.

God's Presence Brings Life (Advent: Nov. 30 to Dec. 21, 2025)

God's everlasting promise to be in relationship with the Israelites and all creation allows hope to take root in even the most hopeless circumstances. God continues to provide and be faithful, bringing life where there was once death, like dry bones being gathered back to life. As texts move into the New Testament in this Advent season, hope is ultimately embodied in human form as God will go to any length to show love, even becoming flesh and dwelling with us. God's presence is found among us in the humble form of a child in Jesus, the one who brings true life to all.
