2020-2022 ARIZONA SOFTBALL HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE





One of the first competitive teams she played for was the Vito-Gro Chicks and then the Blakely Rockets Team. She was a member of the 1952 Rockets National Softball Congress, National Championship Team. She was also selected to the N.S.C. All-Star Team that year. From the Rockets Team she went on to play for the PBSW Ramblers. As a Rambler, she participated in 5 National A.S.A. Tournaments from 1953-1957. She was a member of the A.S.A. 1955 and 1957 PBSW Ramblers National-Runner-Up Championship Teams. She was selected multiple times to Arizona All-State Teams.



Council Meeting Minutes - September 25, 2022

Present: Pastor Chris, Corrine Cursi, Annemarie Dyslin, Diane Johnson, Evan Rogers, Kathleen Rogers, Ellen Riske, Connor Schmidt, Rhonda Schmidt, Sarah Shaw

A. Opening Devotions/Prayer: Pastor Chris opened the meeting with prayer at 10:59 AM.

B. Review and Approval of Council Minutes for August 21, 2022

C. Reports #5 - Report from Holy Trinity/First Evangelical Lutheran Committees: Sarah corrected "outreach committee" and "transition committee" to "partnership committee".

D. Old Business #6 FELC 75th Anniversary: Sarah corrected the date from October 23, 2023 to October 22, 2023.

Rhonda moved to accept the August minutes with corrections. Ellen seconded. The minutes were approved unanimously.

C. Reports

1. Treasurer's Report: Kathleen reported that we are currently in the red due to the shared cost for the AC unit at the school. The AC cost was previously approved by the council. Additionally, there was a charge from Johnson Controls and the utilities were high in July.

7. Approval of Reports: Evan moved that all reports are accepted as given; Connor seconded. Council unanimously approved the reports.

D. Old Business

1. Church Constitution: Sarah gave Ellen the soft copy and she will make changes.

2. COVID-19: Closed. This may be reopened if there are changes that need to be addressed.

3. 2022 Goal for Visioning Strategy: Kathleen reported that sending the apartment complexes FELC postcards to include in the rental informational packets would be more effective than phone calls asking them to put in a postcard that they have not seen. She will follow-up by getting more postcards to send out.

4. Roof Repair: Pastor Chris had the HT facilities person come out with a roofer to look at the roof. Kathleen will check to see if there is any insurance coverage for the roof. Annemarie asked if repairing the spire will be included with the roof repair. Some of the stained glass and caulking needs to be replaced. In addition there is a window panel on the east side of the church that needs to be replaced. The spire and glass will be included in quotes for roof repair.

5. New AC Units: She will send an email to council outlining which designated funds could be used for this. Richard and Ellen will provide information from the Endowment Fund for payment.

6. Gift Shop Space for LSS-SW: Annemarie requested that we delay a decision on renting LSS-SW the gift shop space as FELC is running out of storage space. Ellen and Annemarie will determine what needs to be stored and where it could be stored next week. They will inform council of their findings. Kathleen will update the current MOU with LSS-SW, but not include the gift shop space at this time.

7. Other Old Business: None**E. New Business**

1. Signs: Kathleen stated that since we are hosting more groups at FELC, campus signs need to be updated. Kathleen will double check the signs and the final cost.

2. Grants: Pastor Chris reported that there are several grants that FELC may want to apply for. These include three grants that are due in mid-October. Pastor Chris will meet with Kathleen, Corinne, and Diane on Tuesday, September 27 via Zoom to outline the grants.

3. Advent: Pastor Chris suggested that FELC hold Advent services around noon and HT will hold services at 6:30 PM on Wednesday, November 30, December 7, and December 14. Council was in agreement.

4. Christmas: FELC will hold the traditional Christmas Eve service at 7 PM; HT will hold a Children's Service on Christmas Eve at 5 PM and their traditional services at 7 PM and 10 PM. Since Christmas is on Sunday, FELC will have a Christmas Day service at 9:15.

5. Leadership Expenses: Council approved funding supplies and other miscellaneous expenses for the new leadership team. This includes new business cards.

6. Partnership Committee: The committee will meet to determine their roles and will submit a monthly report to council.

7. Trunk or Treat: Rhonda stated that the youth group would like to hold a Halloween Trunk or Treat in the FELC parking lot. Rhonda will check with Concordia and LSS-SW to see if they want to participate. FELC members can donate treats to be given out, or they can come over to FELC and join in.

8. Other New Business: None

PASTOR'S REPORT

It is good to be with you! I have enjoyed working with the staff and leadership this month! Everyone has been so helpful.

DIVISION OF DUTIES:

Vicar Luis, Pastor Bernie and I are looking forward to serving you. We will be dividing the work in the following ways:

Luis : Preaching (1 or 2 x a month), Youth

Bernie: Preaching (2x a month), Homebound Visits

Chris (1x a month on council Sundays): Preaching, Administration, worship planning, office hours on Tuesday

Pastoral care such as hospital visits, counseling, etc will be done as a team depending on needs of the congregation/Pastoral Availability.

ROOF: I had the HT facilities person come out and look at the roof (Dan Ewart). He brought out a roofer who said it might be able to be covered by insurance. Kathleen is pursuing this, along with the roofer, Mick Heath.

SAVINGS: Joy , Sarah and I have found ways to save \$s together by sharing a worship software App called "Sundays and Seasons" as well as Zoom Accounts between the two churches.

GRANT: Sarah and I spoke about getting the service onto YOUTUBE, I will be writing a grant Hidden Treasures to help us do that. Zoom can continue as well. I believe YOUTUBE is more comfortable for those who are looking for a church. They can view it at anytime and anonymously.

SOCIAL MEDIA: Mike Epping is working with FELC's Social Media. He has met with Joy this week and they are coordinating Facebook/Instagram/Website so that we can get information out accurately. Another way

to let people know what is happening at FELC. I am working on getting an email for Pastor@firstevlutheran.com.

WORSHIP TEAM: I look forward to meeting with the Worship Team soon to discuss Advent/Christmas.

MASKS: At this time, I see no need for masks, unless things change dramatically, I do not believe we will be returning to masks unless the council believes it is necessary. Of course, anyone who feels more comfortable in a mask is always welcome to wear one!

NAMETAGS: I look forward to Joy making nametags for everyone. Although you may all know each other, Pastor Bernie, Vicar Luis and I do not know all your names, and it is of course it is visitor friendly. I hope they will be ready in the next week or so. We can keep them in basket in the entrance way.

HOMEBOUND VISITS: Joy gave me a list of 5 homebound members. Pastor Bernie will be in contact with them to make a visit. If there is anyone you think needs a visit, please let us know.

FIRST TIME VISITOR GROUP: I would love a couple of people to talk with about first time visitors. What kind of follow up have you done in the past? What has worked? Do you give out gifts? Are there phone calls made? I need a creative brainstorming group that can meet for a short time.

I look forward to continuing to work with you. Please let me know if I can be of any help, or if I am stepping on anyone's toes. I try to bounce ideas off of staff and Sarah and ask who is in "charge" of that area in order to learn about what is happening or to discuss ideas with the right people. I may miss something in translation. Please provide grace as we move into this new relationship.




Meet the Pastoral Team
