I was trying to inspire him to rise above some harsh teasing, delivering what I'm sure was a tedious lecture about the great men he was studying in school: Martin Luther King, Jr., Mohandas Gandhi, and Archbishop Oscar Romero. He put up with me for a while and then finally replied in an exasperated tone, "But Mom, those guys were all killed!"


Once again, my son had rendered me speechless.

What do we want for our children? Do we want them to follow Jesus or do we want them to be safe? It is our faith that God will provide for those who are disciples of Jesus and that, even if harm should come to us in this world, we will be brought safely to paradise. But don't we want our children safe here and now? And not

only safe, but successful, prosperous, admired, happy, and a reflection of their fine upbringing; a feather in our parental cap.

Mary's son was a failure in the eyes of the world. Her son was sentenced to a

most dishonorable death between two dishonorable criminals. She was a widow and denied the comfort and protection of her only son. She believed in him certainly, just as we believe in our children, but there is no evidence that she possessed some secret knowledge of how things would turn out in the end. She didn't know any more than we know by faith—that God will provide for us.



Most of us are not openly persecuted for our faith and so the battle lines are not so cleanly drawn. But

> if we look at our society through the lens of the teachings of Jesus, aren't there some choices we have to make? Choices

between worldly success and discipleship; between comfort and service; between security and faithfulness?

I can hear my son's voice, "But Mom, those guys were all killed!"

Yes, they were, son. Yes, they were.
