75TH ANNIVERSARY

VE Day the 8th May is a public holiday. The Parish Council are organising an event to celebrate this National Day. There will be a Church Service at midday, starting with the sound of the WW2 Air Raid Siren. A wreath of flowers will be laid at the memorial and anyone wishing to lay flowers in respect of lost war relatives will be welcome to do so. An Exhibition, of both WW1 & WW2 memorabilia, will be on display in the Church for two days for people to see. There will be tea, coffee and refreshments available as well as a singer, singing Vera Lynn war-time songs. At the end of the Service the Siren will sound the 'All Clear'. The actual Siren that belongs to the village can be seen on display in the Wight Mouse. The WI will, in their Hall, have cream teas available for those who wish to partake.

VICTORY IN EUROPE 75TH ANNIVERSARY:

MEETINGS: The Parish Council have had two monthly meetings since the last issue of our village paper therefore this is a chance to update you all. Our Council minutes are always available on line but I appreciate not everybody looks at them so I will update you with the more important items and also inform you on future events.

CHRISTMAS: Starting with December and the Christmas tree, kindly donated by Brian and Cathy Harding. Our thanks go to Keith and Kevin Joyce and helpers who aided Pete Gosling and me to get the tree located on the Green, this enabled us to have an electric supply for the lights from The Hut and to run our Annual Carol Service close by. Our thanks go to Reverend Nigel Porter our Vicar, and to Andy Price for organising the musicians. Mulled wine and hot mince pies were given

out by helpers in the Hut. Speaking of the Hut, it is disappointing that there has been damage to one end of it caused by acts of vandalism. This means the repairs will cost the Parish Council and ultimately the village.





INTERNET: We continue to try and get BT to resolve Internet problems for those people at the Blackgang end of the village who get abysmal service. IWCC Leader Dave Stewart is battling on our behalf.



DEFIBRILLATOR: Since the closure of Chale Green Stores, we had to remove the defibrillator after losing the electricity supply to the box. Our thanks got to Keith Joyce who has kindly allowed us to place it on his barn wall next to the STUBBINGS sign. This will only be a temporary measure as when BT take the Telephone Box, near the shop, out of service, we will install it in the box with BT's approval. We have already applied for this and follow other villages in the UK where this has happened.

BLACKGANG VIEWPOINT CAR PARK. The surface is becoming increasingly poor due to wear and tear over the years and we are attempting to get it repaired. Island Roads initially said they would carry out repairs but have since refused to undertake the work. Through the IWCC we are exploring other avenues.

The IWCC have said that the Tour of Britain Cycle Race, Final Stage, will take place on the Island in 2021. This could mean a massive income for Island businesses especially and a great spectacle.
