Gilli Danda- A Traditional Sport of India

Gilli Danda is an amateur sport played in the rural areas and small towns all over India, Bangladesh, Nepal, Afghanistan and Pakistan as well as Cambodia and Italy. The game is played with two sticks: a large one called a Danda, which is used to hit a smaller one, the Gilli.

Gilli Danda is known by various other names: it is called Tipcat in English, Dandi-Biyo (डण्डी बियो) in Nepali, alak-doulak (الك دولك) in Persian, dānggūli (ডাঙ্গুলি) in Bengali & Assamese, chinni-dandu in Kannada, kuttium kolum in Malayalam, viti-dandu विट्टी दांडू in Marathi, kitti-pul (കിറ്റിപുല) in Tamil, Gooti-Billa or Karra-Billa or Billam-Godu in Telugu, Gulli-Danda'(गुल्ली डंडा)' in Punjabi, Geeti Danna (گیتی ڈنا) in (Saraiki, Iti-Dakar (اٹی ڈکار) in Sindhi, Lappa-Duggi (لپا ڈگی) in Pashto, Kon ko in khmer, the Cambodian language), Pathel Lele in Bahasa Indonesia, Syatong in Tagalog and Awe Petew in Ilonggo dialect of Philippines.

"Gilli Danda" is played with two pieces of equipment - a Danda, being a long wooden stick, and a Gilli, a small oval-shaped piece of wood.
