

August Pool Committee Update:

The Park Cypress pool had an incident with multiple college age adults grilling, drinking and playing loud music at the pool. A resident wrote the board about the incident and it was brought to the attention of APB who provided us written statements from the two life guards on duty.

Another resident contacted board members about a situation that arose a week or two later where the resident felt that the life guards may have been too harsh in their patrolling of the pool and they felt singled out. The life guards had to warn their children not to run when outside the pool, not to swim at the bottom of the slide and not to use one of the blow-up toys they brought. I am in discussions with the parent and will talk to APB about the issue. The parent acknowledges that their children were running and were hanging out at the bottom of the slide but feels like life guards may have been too harsh given the recent event with the college age adults. The life guards asked the residents to sign a form acknowledging that they were being asked to leave the pool due to their unruly children and the parents refused since it was not completely filled out. The life guards would not fill out the form completely for them to sign, a stalemate resulted and everyone went their merry way.

2026 Swim Team Final Update:

- Swim Team roster was 207 swimmers
- The team went 4-0 in Division 3 competition and will move up to Division 2 next year
- 81 swimmers qualified for the Division 3 Championship meet
- 26 swimmers qualified for the League Championship meet
