"Your camera takes really great pictures!" ~

"Thanks, I taught it everything it knows." A professional photographer for 30 years, I started in the business as a photojournalist for a New Jersey newspaper, *The Times of Trenton.* I'm still working commercially and I consider myself a storyteller with a camera and a time traveler. I'm not interested only in technically perfect images, but ones with heart, and emotion--a story to tell. I shoot with both digital and film (35mm, 120, and up to 4×5").

My presentation will cover street photography, which is essentially documentary photography in public places, and the documentary photo project I've created, <u>Roy Stryker</u>. I'll go into the hows and whys of photographing strangers and shooting life in public. And what to do with them after you've created them.

Digital images should be no larger than 2048 in the greater dimension and should be submitted as a .JPG attachment via email to <u>StVrainPhoto@Gmail.com</u>, no later than Thursday prior to the meeting. Late entries will not be accepted.

New members are encouraged to enter photographs.

Please submit photos each month only after receipt of the newsletter. This is because there may be changes in category

Photo Submission Rules:

File type: JPG files only, please.

Naming convention:

- Category (1S for Special, 2Y for Challenge, 3O for Open, and 4U for Creative)
- Photo title (blank spaces are allowed)
- Photographer's name (blank spaces are allowed)

General example: [Category]-[Title]-[Photographer].jpg Specific example: 3O-Bridal Veil Falls-Ansel Adams.jpg

Photographer Name and Photo Title together should be no more than 45 characters. DO NOT use underscore or special characters (except dash). Size: Digital images no larger than 2048 pixels in the larger dimension.

E-mail photos to StVrainPhoto@Gmail.com. Submit by Thursday night before the Monday meeting. (Example: January 4th for the January 8th meeting). Submitters should get confirmation by Saturday evening that their photos were received. If not, please call and/or re-submit. No digital entries will be accepted after the Thursday deadline except in unusual circumstances by special arrangement with Lynda Clayton. NO digital entries will be accepted at the club meeting. Tips and Tricks

Take an old filter and put a little petroleum jelly around the outside edge of the filter. A little thicker and it will give your photo a blurry, dream like effect around the outside border. Put it on thin enough, and it can create glowing effect where the light hits

the subject. Apply it in different strengths and smears to create all kinds of abstract effects.

Tape different color cello paper over a light sources, flashlights or spot lights. Point these at different angles when taking pictures to get neat glows and highlights. This works great when doing portraits.

Cut a shape out of a piece of paper, heart, star, etc., about the size of a nickel. Tape to an old filter.

Mix and match, or try all three of these tricks and see what you get!

- Keenesburg Animal Sanctuary
- Sloan's Lake/City Park Denver at night
- Bugling Elk Estes Park and RMNP in the fall
- Emerald Lake (RMNP) at Sunrise

There are also paid excursions through Mike's Camera and others for raptor shoots, zoo, etc.

I am gone in February but will be back at the March club meeting. I have contacted the Butterfly Pavilion about getting a group rate (for more than 10), and have asked them to show us tarantulas and scorpions up close for macro photography!! 

Please join nature photographer Ed MacKerrow on a photographic journey with the bears and other wildlife of Coastal Alaska.


Salmon are the lifeblood of Alaska. Many species depend on the return of the salmon each year. Symbiotic inter-species relationships form in salmon choked rivers. This presentation will focus on these relationships.
