



Monthly Photo Showcase for 2025

- Each member will be allowed to submit a TOTAL of three images: Special: 0-2 images; Challenge: 0-2 images; Open: 0-2. We encourage feedback on the showcase images to emphasize the learning process by providing helpful comments to each photographer on the work they submit. If time allows, we will encourage brief feedback on all the submitted photos.
- 2. A brief *Tips and Tricks* for some of the chosen SPECIAL or CHALLENGE topics for each month may be included in the previous month's newsletter to help you capture that photographic topic. We will be asking SVPS members to help write these brief paragraphs for the newsletters.

Photo Submission Rules

(Submit only if you plan to attend the meeting)

- You will receive an email from Reed each month with three links. 1) Special topic, 2) Challenge topic, and 3) Open. You may only enter a total of three photos.
- 2. <u>Prepare your photos.</u> Name all submissions with your **first name + last name and title** of the photo. Example. Leslie Larson–Bear.jpg
- 3. <u>Size your photos</u>. Resize your photos to 2048 pixels on the longer side. Photos should not be larger than 5MB and be in .jpg format.
- 4. Enter your photos (drag and drop) into the correct SVPS link sent out before the meeting every month. Deadline: 11:30 pm Sunday before the following Monday meeting to send in your submissions.
