


Indoor Photography

As the temperatures are getting consistently colder, it is hard for me to be motivated some days to go outside to photograph. Being indoors should not stop you from being creative and practicing your photography, so that is when I turn to indoor photography. You do not need a lot of fancy studio equipment, just some window light and a keen eye. Look around your house for items with small details or small items with lots of details. Here are four photos from my past experiments: button on dress pants, cue tips in their plastic container, and two items from my kitchen drawer. Each of these was placed on a table or the floor on top of a piece of white office printer paper, next to a window. If the sun was strong that day, I may have used a diffuser to soften the light or just closed the sheer curtain on the window.

The photo of the measuring spoons and the whisk are from a series I called "items in my kitchen" and were taken with my mobile phone with a macro lens adapter. I had fun trying to find interesting ways of capturing these items and then showed them to my friends to see if they could guess what each item was. These were two of the easier items to identify, but the lid to my ground pepper container and my hard-boiled egg slicer where harder to identify. I challenge you to find interesting ways to photograph things in your house and then show the photos to your friends and see if they can guess what they are. In addition, I hope these black and white images inspire your entries into this month's Challenge Topic.

No digital entries will be accepted at the club meeting.


Please submit photos each month only after receipt of the newsletter in case there are changes to the category definitions or where to send photos.




