- Special Topic of the Month (0-2 images)
- Challenge Topic (0-2 images)
- Open category (0-2 images)

All members are encouraged to enter photographs.

Submit photographs to Visual Pursuits by the Sunday prior to the meeting at 7 pm.

NO late entries.

NO digital entries will be accepted at the club meeting.

While changes don't happen often, submit photos each month after receipt of the newsletter in case there are updates to the category topics and related definitions.

File Type: Submit .JPG files only

<u>Maximum digital image file size</u> is 7680 pixels wide x 4320 vertically to allow for the best possible resolution.

<u>Photo Title</u>: The name of the image is all that is required (blank spaces are allowed)

General example: Image Title.jpg **Specific example:** Bridal Veil Falls.jpg


<u>Category Code</u>: Images should be placed in the proper Visual Pursuits category. Default is SPEC for Special, and an alert will be triggered if too many images are entered. Please double check the category for each image entered before leaving Visual Pursuits to ensure proper placement.







Longmont BBVA (formerly Compass) Bank Exhibit

Members of SVPS have a unique opportunity to exhibit their photographs to the public on a continuing basis.

BBVA Bank at 19th & Main St., Longmont has three open rooms and the lobby available to members of SVPS where photos can be hung. The rooms have large windows and most photographs on display will be visible to all customers. There is room for about 40 photos measuring about 16×20 including frame and mat. They need to be ready to hang by a hook or wire. There is also great security at the bank.

All members of SVPS are eligible to hang one or two photos at the bank. Those who wish to display photographs in the exhibit should send an email to johnroper2@comcast.net. We will arrange to meet you at the bank or to get the picture(s) from you.

Content of the photographs is not limited; however, members should be aware that the bank is a professional institution, and photographs displayed need to respect the nature of the business and the clientele.

Photographs displayed at the bank cannot be listed for sale, but we suggest you have a tag indicating a title, your name and contact information to be placed near the photo. If a photograph is to be hung or removed, one of the members of the exhibition committee must be notified so we can help. The bank prefers that you not show up on your own because of liability.

Since there is no expiration for the exhibit, we like to rotate them periodically. Therefore, if you have one that has been there for a while, notify John Roper at the email listed above, so he can make room for new photos.

As Jim Bell mentioned at our last meeting, the club owns a variety of studio lighting equipment that is stored at the church. There are multiple Novatron strobe lights (4), umbrellas (2), light stands (2), various extension cords, a sync cord and a flood light with snoot. The lights have two power settings, normal and minus 1 stop. The control unit for the lights is a Novatron 334. Maybe in the future we could hold a workshop on studio portraiture?
