Rapid City, South Dakota October 6 through October 9, 2021 Registration will open on April 1, 2021




Photo Tours will be available every day of the festival beginning on Tuesday, October 6. This new format allows all attendees to enjoy all the photo tours and all sessions.

April's Member Meeting Presentation Black & White Photography & Processing

April speaker Geff Bourke definitely caught the photography bug and his interests branched out from family vacations to nature photography, such as landscapes, birds, and flowers; travel photography with the goal of capturing the culture of his destinations; and urban landscapes...street, people, and decay. He will be speaking about B&W photography and processing.

Since Geff started with film, he was compelled to learn every aspect of development and at one point had built his own darkroom so that he could process his images. Geff has, like many, converted to the digital format. For his nature photography, he is a purist... and uses post-processing software at a minimum. For all other subject matters, digital photography allows such a limitless freedom of expression. Each image can be manipulated in multiple ways to express a desired mood or state of mind. Although he doesn't have his original camera, he does have a collection of antique cameras and often shoots film which he processes at home and then transfers to a digital image.

In college, he studied and obtained a degree in graphic arts. These studies aided him in developing perspective and have definitely impacted how he composes and processes his images. His work is a true expression of how he sees the world.

Recently featured on Understand Photography discussing his passion for B&W imagery! Geff has also been featured in the UK's Black and White magazine for his work of Icelandic horses!

No more than a total of **four** (4) digital images may be entered in the following categories:

- Special Topic of the Month (0-2 images)
- Challenge Topic (0-2 images)
- Open category (0-2 images)

All members are encouraged to enter photographs.

Submit photographs to Visual Pursuits by the Sunday prior to the meeting at 7 pm.

NO late entries.

NO digital entries will be accepted at the club meeting.

While changes don't happen often, submit photos each month after receipt of the newsletter in case there are updates to the category topics and related definitions.

File Type: Submit .JPG files only

<u>Maximum digital image file size</u> is 7680 pixels wide x 4320 vertically to allow for the best possible resolution.

<u>Photo Title</u>: The name of the image is all that is required (blank spaces are allowed)

General example: Image Title.jpg Specific example: Bridal Veil Falls.jpg

<u>Category Code</u>: Images should be placed in the proper Visual Pursuits category. Default is SPEC for Special, and an alert will be triggered if too many images are entered. Please double check the category for each image entered before leaving Visual Pursuits to ensure proper placement.

Silhouette Photography

Taking a good silhouette photo often happens by accident, usually when you want a subject to have a wonderful sunset behind them, but the dynamic range of the scene yielded a silhouette. Now you can make that happen on purpose.

Silhouettes can best be taken at sunrise or sunset when you are facing the sun. Your subject is set against a brighter background. This will put your subject in deep shadow while the light and colors in the sunrise/sunset will be beautifully lit.

If you meter for the sky the dynamic range will put the foreground subject in shadow. The best way to do this is to spot meter for the sky. If you use matrix metering the camera will try to balance the light and everything will be a bit more washed out and not as dramatic.

You can also do this inside. Have your subject in front of a window and meter for the outside light. Make sure to pose your subject so that the silhouette has all the details you are wanting. Shape is important so look for strong shapes in your subject. Watch for arms/legs. Make sure if a subject has two arms or legs you show both unless there is a reason for eliminating one. The same holds true for animals. Show all 4 legs of an animal.

Play around with creative ways to use silhouettes. For more ideas see the articles below.

Twenty-nine (29) members responded to the survey the board emailed out in January and although we received a variety of responses, a few things stood out:

- · When asked what the members enjoyed photographing, the top responses were Landscapes, Macro/close-up, Flowers/Plants and Wildlife. These were also popular responses topics they wanted to have presentations on
- · Other topics that the respondents wanted to learn more about included: Outdoor macro; Photoshop/layers; Lightroom and other photo editing software; Focus stacking software; and Indoor photography / studio lighting.
- · Most respondents were interested in getting together for photo outings, with Landscape or Local Attractions the two most popular responses

Projected Image Division (PID) PSA Competition, Round 3

This is the final round for this year. Submission to PSA is due April 15th.

The schedule for submissions and internal club judging will be:

Photo submission opens: March 25th

Photo submission closes: April 5th (11 pm)

Voting starts: April 6th

Voting ends: April 11th (11 pm)



Rules are the same as before:

- Each club member can submit up to two photos in color or monochrome to the club's Visual Pursuit portal (https://svps.visualpursuits.com/default.aspx); search for the competition: PSA 2021 PID Round 3.
- The photo title should not include your name.
- When club voting begins, every club member can vote via the VP portal. Pick your top images (maximum 6) and provide a 1 to 5 start rating. 1 is low; 5 is high. (you won't be able to vote for your own).
- After voting ends, the top 6, from 6 different photographers will be determined from the sum of the voting.
- Images may be either COLOR or MONOCHROME.
- The content is unrestricted and may include creative images, with all forms of manipulation permitted.
- The maker must have exposed or created all elements of the final image. All submitted images are judged together and are not separated by Color or Monochrome.
- The work must be the maker's and commercial clip art is not allowed.
- Maximum size restrictions are: Horizontal images will be no more than 1400 pixels wide or 1050 pixels tall. Vertical images will be no more than 1050 pixels tall.
- Save the file in jpeg format only. sRGB color space is recommended for optimum results.


