### May Program - Railroad Images of Colorado with Samuel E. Howard

Samuel E Howard - I am an award-winning fine art railroad photographer based in Centennial, Colorado. I combine incredible Colorado landscapes with the rich history of mountain railroading. As one looks at my work, I want them to experience the sounds, smells, and the beauty of our treasured West.

I photograph all over the state of Colorado where steam engines on narrow-gauge tracks are still king. My favorite place to photograph is the Durango Silverton Narrow Gauge RR. The autumn season, when snow blankets the high mountain peaks, is my preferred time to go there. My choice is to photograph spectacular environments that complement the power of the trains. A thundering steam engine is a joy to behold for the photograph and the viewer. It takes us back to a time long gone.

### **Giving Constructive Feedback:**

- Begin with feedback on what works and what is strong about the image. What aspects of the photo first caught your eye? Composition, color, creativity, emotion, etc. Be specific.
- 2. Identify the elements that could be stronger or are distracting and give specific, constructive ideas on how to improve their photos in the future.
- 3. End your feedback by expressing something that you like about the photograph.
- 4. Critique the image, not the subject or the photographer.
