
In Defense and Promotion of the Traditional Doctrine of Hell

by Rome, scholars, schools of thought, nor by the assumed "authority" of the popular evangelical consensus of the day. Doctrine is to be received because of what Scripture reveals....[S]cholarly fraternity is grossly overrated.

Bothered by the unjust quote mining from the writings of the Ante-Nicene Fathers by "scholars" who merely create historical "evidence" for some modern theory on hell, the author has included an impressive appendix which clearly reveals what the Ante-Nicene Fathers taught on the doctrine of hell.
