Instructions for Ministers Fulfilling the 100-Level Courses Requirements for Credit

The assessment of credit hours (including *lab* hours) are determined by the Academic Dean of School of the Called Seminary in order to be in compliance with H.E.C.C. of the State of Oregon for a religious degree granting institution. Credit hour equivalency to the traditional credit hour is an *estimated load* rather than an exact measurement of time.

The Academic Dean has offered qualifying students the following accelerated track which condenses and incorporates the lab requirements for the 100-Level course of study into 6 categories. The time to fulfill all 100-Level lab requirements @ the rate of 40 hours per week will take 16 weeks.

Estimated load (spread over a 16 week period) per week:

- 1.) Lecture (development, delivery, classroom time) @ 5 hrs. per week.
- 2.) Sermon Prep, Delivery, Evaluations ⊂ *Testimony & S. Ch. Service Req's.* ⊃ @ <u>10</u> hrs. per week.
- 3.) Devotional & Prayer Lab @ <u>7</u> hrs. per week.
- 4.) Church Service Lab Time @ 4 hrs. per week.
- 5.) Christian Fellowship and Service Lab @ 12 hrs. per week.
- 6.) Additional Reading @ 2 hrs. per week.

These 6 categories combine to produce an estimated <u>40</u> hours per week. For questions, call (541) 714-3626—ask for the Academic Dean.

SIMPLY STATED

<u>To state this as simply as possible</u>: Concerning a senior pastor (i.e., you as the instructor in your local congregation), fulfilling the lab requires for credit amounts to <u>16 weeks of pastoring</u>. Besides teaching the 10 courses to those you are discipling, just your typical ministry-week as a senior pastor has been estimated to fulfill the 40 hrs. a week lab requirements for the 100-Level courses—for pastoring should naturally include all the above 6 categories required.

Therefore, from the first lesson you prepare for and teach, keep track of the next 16 weeks of pastoring (it must be 16 new weeks in order to earn lab credit, not 16 past weeks of pastoring). At the conclusion of 16 weeks (in which you have also taught all ten courses to those you are discipling), you will have fulfilled all your lab requirements to obtain the 17 credits which can be applied towards the A. A. in Theology Degree (as well as earning the in-house Foundational Theology Degree from the seminary).

To apply for/receive the 17 credits, email a <u>brief</u> evaluation for each of the 10 courses to <u>schoolofthecalledseminary@outlook.com</u>, including your name, church and phone number. The seminary will create for you the completed transcript and diploma for the in-house credits and degree towards an A.A. in Theology Degree. Regarding the evaluations you write: The seminary is not asking you to write a deep evaluation for the courses, but only a sentence or two stating your approval of, or your suggestion for, improving the seminary's supplied outlines for each course. The two examples given below demonstrate the briefness desired regarding your evaluations for each of the ten courses:

Example 1: "Course DC113: I appreciate the solid Scriptural foundation for the ordinances. I believe the outline is extremely useful."

Example 2: "Course CP117: I appreciate the value of this design for strengthening both the individual and for the entire congregation. However, I think it would be an improvement to the course to offer more help in how to train people to write and share their own testimony."
