Student Instructions: The Applied Theology Degree offered through School of the Called Seminary is made available through local Christian fellowships who have approved instructors (*instructors often being local pastors*). All may take the courses (*at the instructor's discretion*) but only those who declare themselves a Christian and have completed the 100-Level courses may take the courses for credit. Student is to record the fulfillment of the lab requirements on this log sheet and turn it in to his/her instructor when completed. See your instructor regarding any questions about the fulfillment of any lab requirements. (*Note: With special permission from the seminary's Academic Dean, some of the lab hours may have an acceptable alternative in fulfilling all credit hour requirements.*)

200-Level Course Lab Requirements

- 1.) **Attended All Class Doctrinal Lessons:** Student must attend all lessons associated with the 12 courses in the Applied Theology course of study. If a lecture is missed, student must work out a time with the instructor to catch up on what was missed.

- 2.) **Written Assignments Completed:** Student is required to go through the recorded lectures for courses DC215, DC217, CV221 and CV233. These lectures are designed to equip the student for his/her required written reports—reports turned in to the instructor.

- 3.) **Required Reading and Textbook Study:** Student must have read through the entire Old Testament. Student is required to read the articles contained in the classroom notes the instructor hands out for each course, reviewing also the Scriptural support set forth in the notes/textbook for each doctrine.

- 4.) **Devotional Study and Prayer:** This is a required six month long lab (*this lab is identical in practice to the 100-Level lab requirements—an additional 6 months beyond the 100-Level requirement*)—**see calendar below for a typical week during the nine month period**. Instructions: The remaining lab requirements listed below run concurrent with those requirements listed above. Estimated total credit-hour equivalencies to the standard credit-hour have been carefully calculated for the remaining labs to take 11 months (48 weeks) to complete. The following calendar diagram for number 5 represents a typical week during that same period. The calendar combines calculated hours covering: Evangelistic Labor (in accordance with course DC217), Christian Service/Ministering (incorporating the principles of DC215), Sunday On-Call Service, Weekly On-Call Service, and Prayer Ministering—all of which our required labs for the Applied Theology Degree. The calendar diagram along with the brief definitions given at the bottom of the next page set forth the lab requirements. See your instructor regarding any questions.

5.) **Evangelistic Labor, Christian Service/Ministering & Church Attendance, Sunday On-Call Service, Weekly on Call Service, Prayer Ministering:** These labs are to run concurrently throughout 11 consecutive months—*see calendar diagram below for a typical week during the nine month period*. Helpful Information Concerning the Above Lab Requirements

All lab credit hour calculations are estimated time loads—a strict adherence to an estimated time is not required. The express evaluation for calculated loads can be obtained through contacting the seminary. However, the following brief definitions and estimations given below are designed to assist the student in understanding the load.

Evangelistic labor: This lab is fulfilled through demonstrating the incorporation of the principles learned through all courses, especially DC217. Evangelistic labor, including ministering to brethren needing deeper ties, e.g.: praying, inviting, sharing the gospel, visits, phone calls, letters, gifts of love, etc. Est. 6 hours per month for 11 months.

Christian Service/Ministering: This lab is fulfilled through the implementation of the student’s perceived giftedness for service under the Great Commission. It is designed to incorporate all the principles learned in all courses, especially DC215. Examples: teaching a Sunday School class, nursery service, food delivery, preaching, teaching, providing rides, etc.—service in accordance with one’s gift. It also includes faithful church attendance in the time estimated load. Est., 28 hours per month for 11 months.

Sunday On-Call Service: Lab-requirement fulfilled through the student expressly making him/herself available to the pastor for on-call service needs for the Sunday Service (whether before, during, or after the morning service). Est. 2 hours per week for 11 months.

Weekly On-Call Service: Lab is fulfilled through the student expressly making him/herself available to the pastor for on-call service needs (as he/she is able) during weekdays—estimated @ 1 hour per week for 11 months.

Prayer Ministering: Student is to faithfully maintain prayer for his/her immediate family members, pastor, and for the needs of both brethren and unbelievers as the Lord may direct. Lab requirements are fulfilled through the student sharing in the prayer needs of the local fellowship. Suggested a part of your daily devotional time with the Lord. Est. 1 hour credit per week for 11 months.

Instructions for Students Taking the 200-Level Courses

(Helpful Information for the Student Seeking to Fulfill All Lab Requirements)

The assessment of credit hours (including *lab* hours) are determined by the Academic Dean of School of the Called Seminary in order to be in compliance with H.E.C.C. of the State of Oregon for a degree granting institution. The determination of credit hours regarding fulfilling the lab-work for the 200-Level course of study is presented in the following breakdown. Credit hours for a nontraditional course of study are ***estimated loads rather than an exact measurement of time***. Questions regarding the fulfillment should first be directed to the student's instructor. (*The instructor, if he has any question in how to answer a student, should contact the seminary's Academic Dean [541] 714-3626.*)

The 200-Level Lab Requirements on the Student's Log Sheet:

(Fulfilling the lab work for the 6 Boxes to be Checked Off)

- 1.) **Attended All Class Doctrinal Lessons:** Student completes an estimated load of **38 hours** for attending all lectures required for the 12 courses.
- 2.) **Written Assignments Completed:** Student listens to the recorded lectures for courses DC215, DC217, CP221 and CP223. These lectures (along with any lecture notes) provide the material for the student's required written reports—student completes an estimated load of **27 hours**:
 - **17 hours** All Required Recorded Lectures.
 - **Broken Down:** Though the lectures do not take 17 hours of listening time, the lectures (some with accompany lecture notes) supply direction/motivation for further research for the written reports. One may find he goes back over various portions of the lecture as he sets out to develop his written report.
 - **10 hours** Written Reports completed.
- 3.) **Required Reading, Textbook Study & Additional Reading:** Student completes an estimated load of **121 hours** (Est. time for reading the Old Testament and going through all the course notes and the various paths of research to which they lead, 106 hrs., & 15 hours additional reading (*Saturdays—roughly 480 pages over 6 mos.*)).
- 4.) **Devotional Study and Prayer Labs:** Student completes an estimated load of **73 hours** over a 6 month period. It is expected that students will continue to maintain a devotional and prayer time their entire life—only 73 hours have been allotted/allowed for lab credit.
- 5.) **Evangelistic Labor, Christian Service/Ministering & Church Attendance, Sunday On-Call Service, Weekly On-Call Service, Prayer Ministering:** Student completes an estimated load of **566 hours** over 11 months:
 - **66 hours** Evangelistic Labor (principles in course DC217; *what the opportunity allows*).
 - **308 hours** ... Christian Service/Ministering & Church Attendance:
 - **Broken Down:** Christian Service/Ministering. The Applied Theology course of study is designed to advance Christians ministering within their local fellowship—especially using the gift the Lord has given them. This works out to roughly 3 hrs. 20 and min. a week throughout the 11 months.
 - **Broken Down:** Church Attendance. Faithful attendance to church services, roughly 3 hrs. 20 and min. a week throughout the 11 months.

- **96 hours** Sunday On Call Service:
 - **Broken Down**: Student informs the pastor that he is on call during the service for any need (e.g., praying or counseling one, cleaning up after service, stacking chairs, food prep, rides home for people, etc).
- **48 hours** Weekly On-Call Service.
 - **Broken Down**: Student informs the pastor that he is on call (if his schedule at all allows for it) for an hour a week for any need that arises (e.g., yard work, fundraiser events, food delivery, prayer).
- **48 hours** Prayer Ministering. 1 hour a week is counted towards fulfilling lab requirements—it is of course hoped that one prays more than that.
