Gene Van Deusen & David Schueler (Wayne County Federation Sportsman Club) shared with the Town Board a quote they wanted to present for modifying the dock at the Harriman Park boat launch. The quote was received from Martin's Custom Tidesides Docks Lifts/Seawalls Docks. They stated the Federation would be willing to pay the \$6,200.00 to install the lower steel bump rail around the current dock and they hoped the DEC would help with the \$30,000.00 portion of the quote and the Town of Sodus would pay for the remainder the DEC would not pay. They are asking for permission to at least pursue with paying for the project of the lower steel bump rail to see that get installed.

Councilperson Dale Pickering shared with Van Deusen and Schueler that before the dock can actually be modified, the boat ramp itself will need to be repaired. The board asked if they could get a quote to repair the launch from Martin's as well. Town Clerk Lori Diver will check with Town Attorney Amy Kendall to see if the "Federation" can start the repair of the "bump rail." Once Van Deusen & Schueler get the updated quote, the Town Board asked if they would come back to a board meeting and present it.

RESOLVED that Supervisor Scott Johnson is authorized to sign the renewal documentation; and it is further

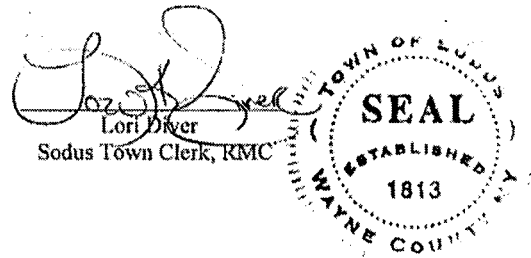

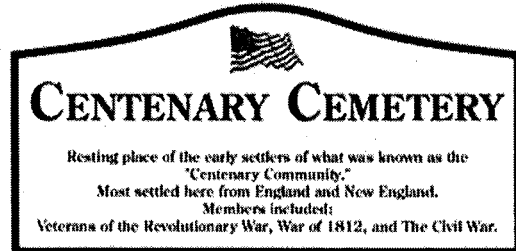

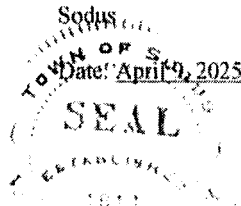

Dear Ms. Kendall,

I hope this letter finds you well. I am writing in response to my name being mentioned during the January 30th Town Board Meeting, where I was referenced as having historical information regarding the ownership of what is now known as the Centenary Cemetery.

At that meeting, Town Historian Sandy Hopkins and Sodus resident Cheryl (Dorman) Monroe proposed the installation of a historical sign at the cemetery. Both Cheryl and Sandy have dedicated considerable time to researching and crafting meaningful text for the sign, with the goal of honoring the cemetery's historical significance. The initial proposal included a request for the Town to fund the installation.

I also noted from the meeting minutes that the cemetery was referred to as "private," and that a search for legal owners yielded no results. I'd like to offer some clarity regarding both the cemetery's past ownership and its current legal standing.

In 1835, Thomas Potwine purchased 107 acres of land from Rueben Graham.(see attached)That deed includes a sketch of a one-acre parcel located within the larger tract. Four years later, in 1839, Symeon (or Simon) Graham sold that one-acre parcel to 48 residents of Sodus. (see attached) —including Thomas Potwine—for the specific purpose of establishing a private cemetery. This transaction is recorded in Wayne County, New York, Deed Book 56:16–17, dated October 24, 1839, from Symeon Graham to Stephen Taylor et al., and is available in the United States, New York Land Records, 1630–1975.

The deed includes the following covenant:

"And the said Simon Graham, party of the first part, does hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof he is the lawful owner of the premises above granted and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein free and clear of all encumbrances. And that he will warrant and defend the above-granted premises in the quiet and peaceable possession of the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever."

Although the cemetery gradually fell into disuse, the Potwine and Hall families continued to recognize their fractional ownership. Nevertheless, for more than 80 years, the Town of Sodus has maintained the cemetery, preserving the grounds and honoring its historical legacy.

Under New York State law, a cemetery that has been continuously maintained by a municipality for an extended period may be deemed abandoned. In such cases, the town is not only permitted but legally obligated to continue its upkeep, even when fractional private ownership remains. Town Law § 291 states that any cemetery used by the public for 14 years vests in the town, which then assumes responsibility

for its ongoing care. Provisions in the Not-for-Profit Corporation Law (§§ 1506 and 1506-c) and General Municipal Law § 165-a further reinforce the public policy that towns inherit and preserve abandoned burial grounds. Legal precedent and state guidance affirm that, once a municipality assumes responsibility, it cannot relinquish it without formal legislative or judicial action. Fractional ownership does not limit the town's right—or duty—to maintain the site, make improvements, or install signage. By law, the land is held in trust for the respectful interment of the deceased and the benefit of the community.

Our family—descendants of several of the original signers of the cemetery's title—has made arrangements to privately fund and install the proposed sign. The purpose is to honor the early settlers and veterans buried there. Although we initially considered applying for a grant, we have since decided to proceed without any public funding.

At this time, we are respectfully requesting the Town Board's approval to move forward with the installation. We are happy to provide the proposed design, location, and any additional details the Board may require for review and approval.

We are grateful for the Town's ongoing care of this historic site and thank you for considering our request. We look forward to collaborating to honor and preserve the historical and cultural legacy of the Centenary Cemetery.


This letter expresses my strong support for the Town of Huron's ("Town") application for a New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation ("NYSEFC") Wastewater Infrastructure Engineering Planning Grant ("EPG").

It is my understanding that, working collaboratively with the Wayne County Towns of Sodus and Rose, the Town desires to study the feasibility of providing wastewater collection and treatment for the areas surrounding Sodus Bay and East Bay, the two remaining Lake Ontario bays in Wayne County that are not publicly sewered. The study will also examine the feasibility of providing wastewater collection and treatment for the currently unsewered Wayne County hamlets of Rose and North Rose. The study would culminate in a Preliminary Engineering Report ("PER") to be utilized to seek further financing through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund ("CWSRF") for construction of a sanitary sewer collection system to serve these areas.

Many of Wayne County's most valuable natural resources are found in and around its Lake Ontario bays. Boating, swimming, fishing, bird watching, hiking, or just taking in the scenic beauty of the area are as important to residents as they are to tourists who make significant contributions to the local economy. Sanitary sewers would reduce septic-related pollution of some of the region's most valuable shared natural resources. The Town of Rose's recent Comprehensive Plan Update identifies the need for a feasibility study for a public sewer system and the exploration of related funding opportunities, as a Priority Action Strategy for attracting growth of businesses and residents in the hamlets.

Without the proper infrastructure to support new growth in the region, new businesses that create jobs and a stronger tax base cannot materialize. This project will protect local waterways and enhance regional sustainability by improving opportunities for economic investment.

March was a "getting back to business" month here at the park. The trout run was hot down at our east entrance and we were filled with fishermen all month. The weather also cleared up just enough to get the park's spring clean up started and right now every area of the park is being cleaned up after the long,brutal winter that we had this year. Aside from our daily dog walkers and hikers,we also started seeing some campers and we brought in \$120 in camping fees for the month.

While inspecting everything during the park's clean up and daily operations,as well as during planning for the upcoming season,a few issues are standing out that will need to be adressed in this upcoming season. Most importantly would be the roof of the pioneer lodge. What were some minor holes and soft spots last year,after this past brutal winter,have become two decent size holes and a large rotted depression in the roof. This was not something that was unforeseen,it had been discussed 4 years ago when the delinquent buildings were removed and we have been saving as much of the camping fees as possible knowing this day would come. It looked as if we were going to get lucky with the movie production company wanting to use the building and were willing to repair it for us,but that did not pan out and we are back to footing the bill. Right now as it stands,the problematic areas of the roof will need to be removed asap for safety purposes. The real question going forward is what will this building be used for in the future here at the park? There are a few possibilities,and if a new roof is going to be put on,now would be the time to rennovate the building for it's future use.

I've also noticed as of late,that most likely due to old pictures that remain online and our still rustic look here,that there has been an upswing in people ignoring many of the park's rules and claiming ignorance. In order to clear up any confusion,i would like to revamp our entrances so people can obviously see we are a fully functioning facility. Here is what I would like to do:

West Entrance

- repair wooden fence around the gate
- paint the fence,sign posts,and parking lot kiosk white
- paint the large park sign green with white lettering
- install more tree rings and mulch beds
- add more signage to the entrance gate,kiosk,and secondary metal gate

East Entrance

- paint posts and kiosk to match west entrance
- add signage directly to the new metal entrance gate
- new mulch around pavillion,latrine,benches,secondary entrance,water fountain and flag pole

We're at the beginning of another green season,so all of the preparations for mowing both the park and cemeteries are being done as well. Every year we keep getting busier here at the park and i'm sure that will continue this upcoming season.
