AMENDED SEQR RESOLUTION
DETERMINATION OF ENVIRONMENTAL SIGNIFICANCE

WHEREAS, the Town of Sodus Town Board (hereinafter referred to as "Town Board"), at their regularly scheduled Town Board meeting held on June 11, 2024, made a determination of non-significance relative to the construction of Water District No. 12, which originally included the construction of approximately 31,000 linear feet of new 8-inch water main to extend the existing potable water distribution system to current unserved areas in the Town of Sodus, Wayne County, NY (the "Original Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Original Project has been amended to include approximately 10,400 linear feet of additional watermain along Buerman Road between Old Ridge Road and Sodus Center Road as well as a potential new control valve/PRV station on NY-88 somewhere between the existing Village of Sodus Well House and the WCWSA pump station at the Joy Road/NY-88 intersection (the "Additional Work"); and

WHEREAS, the Original Project and the Additional Work now collectively constitute the "Action" and the Action is classified as a Type 1 Action under the State Environmental Quality Review (SEQR) regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has reviewed and accepted the amended Full Environmental Assessment Form (EAF) Parts 1, 2, and 3 including the supporting information on the Action prepared by the MRB Group; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has determined that, because the Additional Work will not result in any significant changes to the environmental impacts anticipated for the Original Project, an additional 30-day coordinated review period is not required; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board having completed the 30-day coordinated review and public comment period provided for under the SEQR Regulations for the Original Project, solicited additional feedback from the Involved Agencies for the amended Action; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board received no comments from the Involved Agencies in response to the Town Board's request for additional feedback regarding the amended Action; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board reaffirmed its status as Lead Agency under the SEQR Regulations for the purpose of making the determination of significance upon said Action, by a separate resolution at the November 12, 2024, Town Board meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Town Board has considered the criteria for determining significance as set forth in Section 617.7(c) (1) of the SEQR Regulations and the information contained in amended Full EAF Parts 1, 2, and 3.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that said Action WILL NOT result in any significant adverse environmental impacts based on the review of the Full EAF; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Town Board does hereby make a Determination of Non-Significance on said Action, and the Town Supervisor is hereby directed to sign the amended Full EAF Part 3, the Negative Declaration, as evidence of the Town Board's determination of environmental non-significance.
