Pumpkin Bread

If you like pumpkin bread, you'll love this recipe from Martha Stewart. I've tried others but always return to this one. It makes 3 large loaves so you can enjoy one, bring one to the Chili Block party and freeze one for Thanksgiving!

12 tablespoons (1 1/2 sticks unsalted butter, at room temperature)
3 tablespoons molasses
2 cups sugar
4 eggs
2/3 cup orange juice or water
2 cups pumpkin
3 1/3 cups flour
1/2 teaspoon baking powder
2 teaspoons baking soda
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground cloves
1 cup raisins (you can omit these if you wish)

Preheat oven to 350. Butter three 9x5x3 inch loaf pans.

With an electric mixer, cream the butter, molasses, and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs one at a time until light and lemon colored. Add orange juice and pumpkin puree and mix well.

Sift dry ingredients together into a large bowl and add to the pumpkin mixture, stirring well to thoroughly combine all elements. Mix in the raisins.

Spoon into prepared pans. Bake for one hour, or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool in the pans for 10 minutes, then turn onto racks to cool.

This recipe can be multiplied and freezes extremely well.
