## Education, Youth & A Vision for Triumph!

A Conversation with Professor Warren R. Thompson (Chair, Board of Trustees, Triumph, The Church of the New Age) & Travis M. Mills (Triumph Life Center Staff) November 27, 2020

Travis Mills: What characteristics should an educator have?

**Professor Warren R. Thompson**: You really have to care about your students. You have a care and concern for the material and the field you are educating in but you have to concern yourself with the students. You can't lose sight that these are human beings ... I think you know especially with the COVID pandemic there has to be a level of empathy that you display towards peoples' situations. The deadlines and the criteria, they are what they are. You have to be able to produce certain amount of material that comes in on time but I think as an educator you also have to have a passion for your students and genuine concern for them to progress professional and as well as personally.

**Travis Mills:** As an educator how do you impact the youth?

**Professor Warren R. Thompson**: I think the way that I impact them the most is just being as genuine as I can. You know, presenting the material that they may not be familiar with in a manner that is not too academic it is ...like I am able to take theory and give this practical presentation of it which is really kind of helpful not only for me but for my students.

Travis Mills: Why did you choose a career in social work?

**Professor Warren R. Thompson:** Social work chose me. What happened was I went to college right out of high school but never completed it. Then I started working and had a family and I got to a point when I just knew... I felt stagnated and decided to go back to school to finish my bachelor's degree and kept going and got my master' degree. During that time the prison reentry program was popular and I was fortunate enough to get involved in working in reentry.

**Travis Mills:** As a social worker how can you build a solid family foundation?

Professor Warren R. Thompson, Jr.: My first thought is that the dynamics of what we all consider family has changed so much over the years, right? And the diversity of what is considered family it has to be recognized. So, I don't think really we are still living in an era that we say the 'family' is the mother, father, two kids a dog and a house with a white picket fence. Yet, that is the image that was given to a lot of us when we were coming up on this is what the 'family' should look like. Yet, there are very few people I know that their family looks like that. And then if you also start to add in now the LGBTQ community and the dynamics that go around that the whole view of what a family is has changed. So one of the things that I would do if I am working with someone is I have them identify who they feel is part of their family. Right, because it might be a cousin. They might be closer to their cousin then they are to their own brother. Then you have what you call family of origin that you have no choice over that is the family you were born into so to speak. Yet, when you get a certain age you are able to create a family of choice, right. Now, you may get a partner, you may have children, you may adopt children you may not have children. It may be just you and the partner. Whatever that looks like for you I always just turn it back on the individual and say you identity family for me so that this way we might have a working family foundation as to how we work through that. I can't say no, that is not your family, your family is this; we will never get anywhere like that.

**Travis M. Mills:** What are your goals and plans for Triumph? **Professor Warren R. Thompson, Jr.:** So, let's talk short term goals. My short term goals really would be, to... I want to see the spot in Brooklyn become like the 'spot' man. I think that spot has a lot of potential and I think it has the staff there that it could just really take off. And the ideas and creativity that is around that Brooklyn location I just think the sky is the limit there. Next, I want to see the Newark location get setup. I think if we can get Brooklyn moving the way it could be... and get Newark moving the way it could be... I think at that point we are able to re-evaluate some of the other properties or locations to see do they still work with Triumph's mission? I think Triumph has a tremendous amount of potential I think it's a really, really great spiritual center and I see that we really have a great team of people that we can move towards at least the short term goals at this point and then re-evaluate and see where we want to go in the long term.

## MEDITATION USING A TIBETAN SINGING BOWL

We open our virtual Sunday gatherings each week with a guided meditation along with a Tibetan singing bowl.



Tibetan bowls are created with alloys that

usually contain from five to seven precious metals, which are connected to the planets of our galaxy: lead (Saturn), tin (Jupiter), iron (Mars), copper (Venus), mercury (Mercury), silver (the Moon) and gold (the Sun). The size of the bowl and the ratio between the metals affect the tone, vibration and quality of sound produced by the bowl. Besides their traditional use for meditation, Tibetan singing bowls are used for deep relaxation and muscle regeneration, to relieve pain in the joints, muscles and shoulders, to ease pain related to sciatica, the digestive system, headaches and migraine or spine injuries, to improve circulation, release tensions or blockages, to open the energy flow,



eliminate the toxins from the body. I enjoy using the singing bowl as a tool for intentional, mindful breathing as well as creating melodies to sing. To learn more about Tibetan Singing Bowls:

## Happy Hanukkah



Dedication or Festival of Lights
Begins The Evening of
December 10, 2020 with the last
night on December 18, 2020

Hanukkah is an eight-day Jewish holiday that is observed in late fall or early winter. Hanukkah celebrates the victory of a band of Jewish warriors over their oppressors.

It also commemorates the miracle God performed when a vial of oil—needed to rededicate the Holy Temple in Jerusalem—lasted for eight nights instead of one.

In the story of creation as told in the book of Genesis, the description of each day concludes with the phrase, "And there was evening and there was morning," leading rabbis to determine that a day begins with evening. Therefore, holidays, like all other days in the Hebrew calendar, commence in the evening.

The word "Hanukkah" is Hebrew for "dedication."
