MEET Rev. Dr. Rob Joy

Wickliffe Presbyterian Church Temporary Pastor May 11-August 31, 2025

I retired from Grace Church of Columbiana, Ohio, in September, 2023 where I served since 2007. Before this I served the First Congregational Church of Wayne, MI, the Community Congregational Church of Kewaunee, WI, and the First Congregational Church of Toulon, IL, all members of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches. This was a career of 32 years of ordained ministry. I earned a B.A. in Psychology (Philosophy minor) from Edinboro University of PA (1988), a Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary (1991), and a Doctor of Ministry from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary (2007). My doctoral thesis was on how to grow the unity of the local church through involvement of spiritual practices. At the beginning, I was born in Cheektowaga, NY, and was raised in Corry, PA, near Erie. I worked with my dad and brother in building contracting until I felt the call to ministry and started my preparation for that career in 1984. I met the love of my life, Juliann (Jules) Joy, a PCUSA pastor at Princeton Seminary, and we have four children: Ben, Nate, Shannon, and Anna and three grandchildren. The last update on my children has Ben living in Parma and running a home inspection business, Nate living in Boardman, working for a housing and landscaping business in sales, Shannon in New Wilmington, PA, and managing a Dollar General "super store," and Anna a junior 4.0 student at Kent State (main) majoring in Neuroscience and Biochemistry.

One of the topics about church life I enjoy reading about the most is the future of society and the Christian Church. Bragging about my children is a favorite pastime, along with woodworking, most home repairs, hiking and hunting with my extended family in northwest PA, and mountain hiking wherever a trail leads. I completed a three-week pilgrimage, covering 130 miles, on the Camino de Santiago northern mountain route in Spain in 2019, part of my "bucket list." A couple of tidbits about me you probably don't know is I survived both a heart attack and a 40-minute arrest in 2011, and a charging wild boar attack in 2013. Both were "fun" for me, but not so much for my family! Despite my thirst for adventure, one of the things I enjoy the most is a simple good cup of (decaf) coffee and a one-on-one conversation. Jules and I plan an extended western camping trip in the early fall.







PENTECOST OFFERING SUNDAY, JUNE 8, 2025

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the HOLY SPIRIT and the BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH!! The Holy Spirit remains with us still, connecting us with the church of the past, continuing to inspire the church of today, and pointing to the church of future. Each year, this celebration is marked by receiving the Pentecost Offering which nurtures the faith of those who are the church to come.

Pentecost arrives 50 days after Easter and 10 days after the Ascension - when Jesus ascends and the church is born. If His mission and ministry is to continue, it is upon us to keep it going, and we have the Holy Spirit to lead us!

Our gifts to the Pentecost Offering connect with God's hope and future, supporting Ministries with children, youth and young adults by building a life of faith.

Congregations keep 40% of receipts to initiate or support programs for young people in our communities.

25% of the offering goes to Young Adult Volunteer experience to train and equip volunteers to engage in mission in eight sites around U.S. and around the world.

25% supports ministries with youth ages 12 - 18 to create New Quicksheets - free downloadable resources for youth ministry, fund the Senior Project which offers a path and plan for graduating seniors to explore their next steps in faith, community, and vocation.

10% supports the "Educate a Child, Transform The World". The goal is to inspire and motivate Presbyterians to better the lives children to ensure equitable, accessible, quality public education that all children may grow in the fullness of life in the image of God.

Since the Pentecost Offering began in 1998, Presbyterians have raised nearly \$18 million for ministries that benefit younger members to help them build a strong foundation of faith.

BENEVOLENCE FUND GUIDELINES- WPC AND TLCC ONLY

- 1. The Session is responsible for deciding who is eligible to receive help during time of financial need.
- 2. The Session shall maintain confidentiality regarding recipients and their circumstances.
- 3. If possible, Session will discuss and approve the distribution of funds at a stated meeting. Reaching out to Elders via e-mail will be acceptable as funds need to be distributed in a timely manner. Session will vote on e-mail at the next stated meeting. Clerk of Session is responsible for sending the e-mails and bringing said e-mails to Session.
- 4. We will only distribute funds to a family twice a year unless Session approves that family is in need of additional help.
- 5. Funds shall only be distributed in check form made out directly to the business, e.g. utility, doctor, pharmacy, house payment, etc. A check will never be issued to the recipient. Using funds to purchase gift cards for food or gas as needed would also be acceptable.
- 6. The fund will only receive money through contributions from congregational donations and fund raisers with no money being transferred from other areas of the budget. The last Sunday of the month is stated as Benevolence Sunday. Members can place donations in the envelopes in the bulletin. Loose money collected on that Sunday will also be applied to the fund.
- 7. This fund is available for any Wickliffe Presbyterian member as well as TLCC Staff.
- 8. A written record shall be kept by the Clerk of Session of all dispersed funds and action taken.
