#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

NEW BUSINESS: Jim Viken warned us that there is some dysfunction on the U.S. Mint's website. His order for 2021 Morgan / Peace replica dollars was lost. All club members should proceed with caution!

The supplies dealer that had signed up to attend the May 2021 Gallatin Coin Show broke down in his truck near Memphis and never made it to the show. We may have a line on a new supplies dealer to attend the upcoming December show.

The results of the May 2021 Gallatin Coin Show are in! The club made a \$1,300 profit. There was some controversy over the amount to be paid to the Gallatin Civic Center. After the coin show concluded, they asked for \$2,700 which was inconsistent with what they originally quoted. We finally agreed on \$1,520 as the amount to be paid for lease of the gymnasium. For the May 2022 Gallatin Coin Show, we should expect a significant increase in price. Steven Meyer and Scott Weaver suggested that we get a firm price quote in advance of the December 2021 show.

Two candidates, Donald H. Kagan, PhD and Ralph W. Ross, PhD, are running for ANA president. The deadline for ballots is July 1st. Also, eight persons are running for seven Board of Governors positions.

The club voted by raising hands in favor of Ralph W. Ross.

It was suggested that the club vote for everyone running for the Board of Governors except Mark Lighterman. Since Mr. Lighterman will already be attending Board meetings in the capacity of parliamentarian, it seems redundant to elect him to be a governor as well.
