DECEMBER 2024 - GALLATIN COIN SHOW REPORT

- 621 door prize tickets were issued to attendees during the show (325 on Friday & 296 on Saturday) .
For the May '24 show 528 (295 / 233).
For the Dec '23 show 547 (306 / 241).
- The numbers for 12 hourly door prize tickets were announced during the show (6 on Friday & 6 on Saturday). 3 of the hourly door prizes were claimed on Friday and 0 were claimed on Saturday.

- 2,179 postcards mailed; 216 were returned by attendees at the registration table.

- The reasons for the decline in net profit from the May 2024 show were:
 1. Costs to print flyers and postcards at Fed Ex more than doubled from \$257 up to \$574 (increase of \$317).
 2. Cost to rent the gymnasium (+ misc. charges) increased from \$1,612 to \$2,193 (increase of \$581).
 3. Postage expense increased about \$100.
 4. Dealer table rents collected were down about \$350. I am trying to collect \$650 of delinquent dealer table fees for the Dec '24 show.

- For the upcoming May 2025 show, we have already collected \$3,185.00 in table rentals from 19 dealers.

- There were 3 no-shows at the Dec 2024 show. One had a medical condition requiring hospitalization (Gonzalez); one had a spouse who was in an auto accident (Mason); and one had a family emergency at the last minute (Dooley). Each dealer prepaid their table fee and are eligible to roll over their prepayment to the May '25 show.

- The P.A. system at the Gallatin Civic Center was down throughout our Dec '24 show. On Friday, I announced the hourly door prize winners on a separate P.A. system in the gymnasium. On Saturday, I had to stand in the center of the gymnasium and shout out the winning numbers since the P.A. system in the gymnasium no longer worked.

- The reasons for the decline in net profit from the Dec 2024 show were:
 1. We had four tables unoccupied (not rented) on Friday and six tables unoccupied (not rented) on Saturday.
 2. Three other tables were rollovers from the Dec '24 show due to medical reasons and an auto accident.
 3. Labor costs were up \$230 from the Dec '24 show. The hourly rate of pay to the people working the registration desk increased from \$15 to \$20. \$20 is what IMEX paid their registration desk workers in 2023. The total paid to the crew who setup tables Thursday evening increased from \$150 in Dec '24 to \$200 in May '25.
 4. Cost of security services increased from \$1,200 to \$1,440. The increase was necessitated by the Sumner County Sheriff's Dept. \$45.00/hour minimum.
 5. Postage expense increased about \$55.

- For the upcoming Dec. 2025 show, we have already collected \$5,250.00 in table rentals from 25 dealers.

- There was 1 no-show at the May 2025 show (Beeson). He did pay for his table but the reason he did not setup for the show is not known.

- Possible reasons for lower attendance were:
 1. The show had to compete against the Biloxi, MS show held on the same weekend.
 2. The show was sandwiched between the Central States show the weekend before and the Pittsburgh show the weekend after.
 3. Our show was held on Mother's Day weekend.

- Possible reasons for not renting all tables:
 1. I started calling dealers on my waiting list two weeks before the show date. Two out of twelve dealers on the waiting list responded favorably to setting up for our show. Several dealers indicated they already had made other plans.

Hope you two are staying cool and having a decent week so far. I've started talking to the Nashville Public Library about a book donation, per the conversations at our last meeting. Here's what I've gathered:

- I told them we were interested in purchasing the Red Book Coin Guides series (https://whitman.com/red-book-series/?srsltid=AfmBOoqBW2nzwdjFIYkTdon1KZ8VF_vSX64r1qI3zTxsMYOJNWLmpQlw), but that we hadn't figured out which in the series to purchase.
- The library would love to have whichever of the Red Book guides we send.
- Regarding popularity, they noted that US Coins are more popular than US paper money, and that international coins and paper currency are also popular requests.
- Anything purchased needs to be shipped to us, and then we take the materials to Noel Rutherford, Materials Services Manager
