Concurrent Driver Education Program: The student may apply for and obtain a learner license from the Texas Department of Public Safety upon successful completion and mastery of Module One. This must include a minimum of six hours of classroom instruction for Module One.

Block Driver Education Program: The student must complete and master all of the modules (a minimum of 32 classroom instruction hours) before he/she may apply for and obtain a learner license from the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Under no circumstances may any behind-the-wheel instruction be permitted until a learner license has been issued to the student by the Texas Department of Public Safety.

Required documents: 1) Valid Learner License, 2) Verification of Enrollment and Attendance Form, 3) DE-964 from PTDE course providers (found on Appendix A) which provided the driver education course, 4) The vehicle used for the Road Test must be able to pass an inspection where everything works properly, have a valid inspection sticker, valid registration sticker, and current insurance, 5) Money to pay for license.
