Residents plan protest as Peter Kelly blocks access to Queens County beach

EAGLE HEAD, Queens County, Nova Scotia - Residents in a small Nova Scotia community near Liverpool are planning a peaceful protest today at noon as work on a housing development continues to block access to a local beach and threaten sensitive wildlife and wetland habitat.

Members of the group, Protecting Eagle Head Beach, have organized the rally to bring attention to the damage being done to their beloved beach, after former Halifax mayor Peter Kelly began construction on oceanfront land he recently purchased.

The 1,100-member-strong grassroots group is demanding answers from provincial and municipal government officials. Members want the work stopped immediately until questions of access and environmental devastation can be properly investigated.

The protest is planned for noon today (Monday) on Eagle Head Beach and on the Eagle Head Road, near where construction is happening.
