

Knights of Columbus Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest 2022-2023 Council Guidelines

Eligibility:

The State Council Contest is open to all Catholic students in grades eight through twelve in public, private, and parochial schools.

Timetable:

<u>June 2022 - January 1, 2023:</u> Councils order Knights of Columbus essay contest kits from Supreme Council. Councils should then contact Religious Educations Programs in the area as well as publish announcements of the contest in local parish bulletins.

Councils judge essays submitted and make appropriate awards to the contest winners.

January 5: Councils submit first place essays in each grade level (8, 9, 10, 11, 12) no later then January 5 to the State Council for judging. At the State Council there are 2 judging categories Division1: 8th and 9th graders, Division 2: 10th through 12th graders. Supreme will be judging all first place essays at each grade level 8 through 12. Therefore, make sure you submit first place winners in each grade level.

<u>February 15:</u> State Council winning essays submitted to Supreme for International judging <u>May:</u> State Council makes awards to the first, second, and third winners in each category

All essay contest winners and their parents will be notified prior to the State Convention and invited to the Sunday morning breakfast/awards presentations as guests of the Connecticut State Council.

Essay Theme/Topic:

The theme/topic of this years essay contest is:

"In an essay of 500- 750 words, explain how young Catholics can evangelize our faith to families and friends who have turned away from religion and encourage them to return to the Church and embrace the sacraments?"

Guidelines:

- * essays must reflect the assigned theme/topic and be submitted by the published deadline
- * essays are to be the students original work
- * essays must be typed on 8 1/2" x 11" paper, **one sided, double spaced**, with 1" margins
- * essays must be between 500 750 words
- * students name should appear only on the knights of Columbus Essay contest Form which should be stapled to the essay
- * all entries become the property of the Knights of Columbus and will not be returned
