## **DETAILS:**

Greenwich Township's Broad Street School will mark Dr. Benjamin Franklin's 300<sup>th</sup> with a Ben-approved, school-wide party. Teachers and students, dressed in period clothing and accessories, will experiment with quill pens and early printing methods in their lessons, enjoy an early American feast and treats, and play Revolutionary-era games. In addition, a town crier will ring hourly letting the students know that "all is well." The day's main event occurs at 1:30 p.m. in the school's auditorium when the entire school will gather for a videoconference with Benjamin Franklin (aka world renowned impersonator Dean Bennett). The third and fourth grade students have prepared questions and all students are eager to learn about Ben Franklin's life from the legend himself. Also, Vic Arlington from the Gloucester County Historical Society will bring antique money from New Jersey and Pennsylvania and share with the students what life was like as a child during this time period.
