Janice Fernow, 94, of Clearwater, Florida passed away peacefully in the presence of her daughter, Tamara Rowe, and granddaughter, Charlotte Rowe, on February 2, 2025.

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.








Invitation to Communion
