

Prayer of the Day

Benevolent God, you are the source, the guide, and the goal of our lives. Teach us to love what is worth loving, to reject what is offensive to you, and to treasure what is precious in your sight, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

Semicontinuous First Reading: Hosea 11:1-11

Hosea compares God's love for Israel to the love parents have for their children. Whether teaching toddlers to walk or dealing with a child's rebellion, good parents continue to love their children as they try to lead them to life. In the same way, God's love will not let Israel go.

A reading from the prophet Hosea.

When Israel was a child, I loved him, and out of Egypt I called my son.
 The more I called them, the more they went from me; they kept sacrificing to the Baals

and offering incense to idols.

- ³ Yet it was I who taught Ephraim to walk; I took them up in my arms, but they did not know that I healed them.
- ⁴ I led them with cords of human kindness, with bands of love.
- I was to them like those who lift infants to their cheeks.

 I bent down to them and fed them.
- ⁵ They shall return to the land of Egypt, and Assyria shall be their king, because they have refused to return to me.
- ⁶ The sword rages in their cities; it consumes their oracle priests and devours because of their schemes.
- ⁷ My people are bent on turning away from me. To the Most High they call,

but he does not raise them up at all.

- How can I give you up, Ephraim?
 How can I hand you over, O Israel?
 How can I make you like Admah?
 How can I treat you like Zeboiim?
 My heart recoils within me;
 my compassion grows warm and tender.
 I will not execute my fierce anger;
 I will not again destroy Ephraim,
 for I am God and no mortal,
 the Holy One in your midst,
 and I will not come in wrath.
- They shall go after the LORD, who roars like a lion; when he roars, his children shall come trembling from the west.
- They shall come trembling like birds from Egypt and like doves from the land of Assyria, and I will return them to their homes, says the LORD.

Semicontinuous Psalm: Psalm 107:1-9, 43

Reader: Give thanks to the LORD, for the LORD is good,

for God's mercy endures forever.

ALL: Let the redeemed of the LORD proclaim

that God redeemed them from the hand of the foe,

Reader: gathering them in from the lands;

from the east and from the west, from the north and from the south.

ALL: Some wandered in desert wastes;

they found no path to a city where they might dwell.

Reader: They were hungry and thirsty;

their spirits languished within them.

ALL: Then in their trouble they cried to the LORD,

and you delivered them from their distress.

Reader: You led them on a straight path

to go to a city where they might dwell.

ALL: Let them give thanks to you, LORD, for your steadfast love

and your wonderful works for all people.

Reader: For you satisfy the thirsty soul

and fill the hungry with good things.

ALL: Whoever is wise will ponder these things,

and consider well the LORD's steadfast love.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-11

Life in Christ includes a radical reorientation of our values. Just as the newly baptized shed their old clothes and put on new garments, so Christians are called to let go of greed and take hold of a life shaped by God's love in Christ.

A reading from Paul's letter to the Colossians.

¹So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. ²Set your minds on the things that are above, not on the things that are on earth, ³ for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. ⁴When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

⁵ Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed (which is idolatry). ⁶ On account of these the wrath of God is coming on those who are disobedient. ⁷ These are the ways you also once followed, when you were living that life. ⁸ But now you must get rid of all such things: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and abusive language from your mouth. ⁹ Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices ¹⁰ and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. ¹¹ In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, enslaved and free, but Christ is all and in all!

Gospel: Luke 12:13-21

In God's reign, the "rich will be sent away empty." Jesus uses a parable to warn against identifying the worth of one's life with the value of one's possessions rather than one's relationship with God.

The holy gospel according to Luke.

Glory to you, O Lord.

¹³ Someone in the crowd said to [Jesus,] "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." ¹⁴ But he said to him, "Friend, who set me to be a judge or arbitrator over you?" ¹⁵ And he said to them, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." ¹⁶ Then he told them a parable: "The land of a rich man produced abundantly. ¹⁷ And he thought to himself, 'What should I do, for I have no place to store my crops? '¹⁸ Then he said, 'I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. ¹⁹ And I will say to my soul, Soul, you have ample goods laid up for many years; relax, eat, drink, be merry. '²⁰ But God said to him, 'You fool! This very night your life is being demanded of you. And the things you have prepared, whose will they be? '²¹ So it is with those who store up treasures for themselves but are not rich toward God."


Great Thanksgiving

For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen


Invitation to Communion

If for some reason, you are unable to consume either the bread or wine please bring what was not consumed to the ushers or the pastor as soon as the service is completed.


