Taize Prayer Waiting

Wednesday, December 10 - 7:15 PM

Truly, the Lord is waiting to be gracious to you...

-Isaiah 30:18a

Isn't Advent about us waiting for Jesus to show up? This simple line from Isaiah opens a whole new picture of this season of waiting. Do we approach Advent waiting on God as if God isn't already here? Isaiah is inviting us to see that God is the one who initiates the waiting with gifts already prepared for his beloved. Advent invites us to anticipate, to be curious, expectant, and hopeful.

Have you ever had the experience of spending weeks looking for the perfect gift for someone you care about, beautifully wrapped the gift, and then had to wait for the moment of seeing their face when they opened your gift? This is the image our reading today invites.

We approach each Advent waiting anew for God's arrival in the person of Jesus. Christ is the lover who endows his beloved with life-giving gifts. Each gift is selected as the perfect answer to our deepest longing. What is the desire of your heart today? What is the word of comfort or mercy you need to hear? What companionship do you long to find in God? God waits with eager anticipation for us to receive his Son and open the gifts prepared for each of us by name.

Tonight, look deep within yourself and notice and name your greatest needs and desires. Tell them to God; not so God knows them, God already knows them, but so that you will recognize the gifts and the Giver when they arrive. And maybe you will even see the joy on God's face in the moment of surprise when the gift arrives in your heart.

Good evening! In the name of Christ, it is our privilege to welcome you to St. Paul's Spirituality Center. As we gather this evening, We would like to offer hospitality, introduce you to our congregation and our Spirituality Center, give a little background about Taizé Prayer and what to expect in worship this evening. If you are here for the first time, our restrooms are in the breezeway just outside the main doors of the church.

About Taizé Prayer The Taizé style of sung prayer mirrors other forms of meditative or contemplative prayer. The gentle repetition of a single thought, in this case, expressed in music, allows us to hear God's voice in the text. The text melts away creating an interior silence for an encounter with God. The music holds the time and space for prayer. Each piece of music has a simple thought that invites the participant to bring their own story, their own needs, to this time of prayer.

How To Participate First, as you gather in the dimly lit room, you might want to simply review your day. Notice what still has your attention and anything that is a distraction to being present to this time of prayer. You might place these distractions at the foot of the altar or the doors of the church. But also notice things beyond your to-do list that are taking space in your heart. What are your needs and concerns, what do you desire most at this moment in your life? What needs to be celebrated, discerned, or even let go of? Bring these things to God tonight!

Singing and Prayer before our Icons The short repetitive sung mantras are gateways to prayer. Although each chant has a text, often with deep theological meaning, this isn't a Lutheran Hymn Sing! (We will do that someday too!) The music is gentle and quiet. You are encouraged to sing or even hum as it serves your prayer, but no one should feel a need to lead the singing or encourage others to sing. All should blend into gentle, contemplative prayer.

After the scripture reading for the evening, there will be an extended time, with several pieces of music sung; you are invited to come forward and light a candle before one of the icons in the room. There will be time for all to move slowly and prayerfully. There is no need to form a line. The music will continue until all have had ample time to participate and pray.

Silence After our time of prayer and candle lighting, we will share profound silence. You can expect that to be 10 - 15 minutes long. The musicians are the timekeepers, so your only role is to sink into the silence and allow God to speak. It is helpful if all of us do our part to minimize distractions. Please put your programs aside and again be sure your cell phones are off and avoid any distracting movement.



Offering We leave a basket at the back of the church for an offering. Your presence and prayer are the most important gifts you bring to our community. However, your contributions support the Spirituality Center our Taizé and Retreat ministries. Our congregation uses an online giving service and with this QR code you can create an online account and make a donation towards our Taizé Ministry. If you use the app and it asks for an "Invite Code" it is MW9599. Checks should be made out to St. Paul's Lutheran Church. Thank you.







You are invited to come forward, a few at a time, to light a candle and place it in the sand as you offer your own prayer. There is no need to form a line as the music will continue until all have had time to come forward and pray.

Maybe tonight in your prayer, you can simply experience God waiting with you.





Dona Nobis Pacem Domine






