
### HBC YOUTH HAUORA NETWORK


### OUR BACKGROUND

'Resilient Youth Ecosystem' project the Hibiscus and Bays Local Board started in 2020.

In June 2023 a group from across 18 organizations came together as a continuation of a 'Resilient Youth Ecosystem' project that the Hibiscus and Bays Local Board had developed. In August we were selected as participants in the Ember Innovations Flourishing Youth In North Auckland Challenge which has brought us here - we now have over 60 different organizations represented to date and a clear vision for the future.

We are building a strong structure as a collective to ensure we can stay on mission together

Everyone is welcome, there is no minimum participation, fees or conditions, we are just committed to creating better outcomes from our young people and we believe it will be easier with you, no matter how you engage with us.

### **MEASURES**

We are working with intent and purpose. Measuring our impact is essential so we are building in measures to everything we do - starting with the basics:

- 1. Numbers and participation with meetings & newsletters
- 2. Every 6 months we are doing an engagement survey of the database
- 3. We are gathering and compiling available data on youth wellbeing across our area and wider.


## WANANGA RANGATAHI Youth discussion


