What have we been up to?



Recent events have brought to light the challenges we face in defending the freedom to read. In response to book challenges within Nixa Public Schools, we have been actively engaged in supporting the retention of books and promoting open dialogue. We firmly believe that diverse perspectives and thought-provoking literature play a crucial role in fostering critical thinking and empathy among students and reflects a curricular need.

The recent decision by the Nixa school board to establish a standing committee for future book challenges is a strong step towards meeting the district's curricular needs while better managing the continuing onslaught of book challenges. The committee's aim is to be more consistent, utilize trained educators who must reflect minimally biased viewpoints and adhere to state and national expectations while satisfying our district's curricular needs. That said, U-Turn feels it is essential to include only professionals that can truly represent accepted educational practices and standards in an unbiased fashion. We will require transparency.

While progress has been made, we must recognize that there is still much work ahead of us. The preservation of intellectual freedom requires ongoing efforts from all of us who believe in the power of books and education. Pridefest



The Missouri house and senate have adjourned for the session. Luckily, a number of bills that could have been disastrous for public education were not passed. Bills are eligible for pre-filing in December and one that we can be sure is going in for consideration could affect the way public library board positions are chosen. Stay tuned for more information as filing time gets closer. As a reminder, U-Turn in Education is a non-partisan organization. We do follow legislation regarding issues of intellectual freedom.
