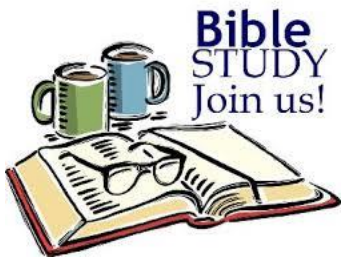

From the Minister's Desk... (Repeat from last week - on purpose!)

"We are in this MINISTRY together"

"If you do what you love, you'll never work a day in your life." This is a quote from Marc Anthony, and oh how right he was. I have been a minister for over thirty years, and have worked alongside many wonderful teams of volunteers around me, doing what we love. And the work has always been joyful. There is no match anywhere to compete with the smiles of appreciation on the faces of individuals who, after being blessed by the work of care and compassion of the church, of one kind or another, walk away feeling seen and loved. This is what ministry is about. Ministry? What exactly is that though? "Ministry" is from the Greek word *diakoneo*, meaning "to serve". In the New Testament, ministry is seen as service to God and to other people in His name. Jesus provided the pattern for Christian ministry—He came, not to receive service, but to give of himself to others (Matthew 20:28; Mark 10:45; John 13:1-17).

To do active service for God requires creativity in order to effectively reach the diverse and complex generation that we now live. I think people who are creative are very blessed. I know that there are no shortcuts, but its always good to be driven by the fact that we serve an ideal which is Greater than ourselves, and this keeps us doing what we love. I've heard it said that "Do what you love, and you will find the way to get it out to the world."

Ministry today has taken on more of a vocational meaning, as we call pastors "ministers" to full-time service. As a pastor, I spend my life in the ministry, and offer service to others, and so that designation as minister is correct, but pastors are not the only ones who are to be involved in ministry. From the early New Testament churches to the churches today, each Christian should be in the ministry of helping others and the wider world (*Romans 12:3-8, 10-13; 2 Timothy 2:24-26*).

Though there is a major emphasis on ministering in spiritual things, as sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with others so people can come and receive Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior, ministry can, and does, include responding to people's physical, emotional, mental, vocational, and financial needs. We have done this, but don't call it as such...but it is ministry! We do this here at Pioneer Memorial and Stoney Creek. So, let's continue serving together in the ministry!

However, there may be someone who is yet to identify that particular ministry to serve and not quite sure how to get involved just yet. Is it Outreach? Property? Worship? Children and Youth? Discipleship? Pastoral Care? Ministry and Personnel? Or something else? If you want to serve and still unsure, follow the leading of the spirit and come talk with me.
