
<u>Minister's Message</u>

Dear Members & Friends of Grace Community,

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another. "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." Luke 2:15

It's quite an extraordinary thing when you stop to think about it. Every year at Christmas, all around the world, billions of people revisit Bethlehem to see, once again, "this thing that has taken place." Not in a physical sense, of course, but in a metaphysical sense... time and space are suspended, and it is as if we are also there on those hillsides with shepherds, and flocks, and angel chorus and starry skies. We hear again the ancient story and are transported to that night. That night. That night... foretold by the prophets when a ruler would come out of Bethlehem to feed his flocks... a root from Jesse who would redeem his people. That night, when "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." That night, of which Mary sang in revolutionary terms, "God has brought down the powerful from their thrones, and lifted up the lowly." That night, on which the angels announced "peace on earth." That night, when God unfolded a bold vision of a world newly born, and salvation in a new-born.

And so, we join those first witnesses from two millennia ago. We also witness to "this thing that has taken place." And what has God made known to us? That Hope lights up the darkest of nights; that Peace is the promise to all; that Joy unites us in song; that Love is the final Word. But not all of us. Only those of us for whom God has made these things known.

In this Christmas season, your church invites you to remember God's grace, and give thanks for another wonderful year of witness in Jesus' name. Your church needs your ongoing generosity of time and talents so that we might continue to make known to others the love of God in Christ Jesus.
