FATHER'S MESSAGE

RENOUNCING THE WORLD TO BRING OTHERS TO CHRIST

What can a sixth-century monk from Mount Sinai teach us about evangelism?

We have arrived at the Sunday of St. John Climacus, also known as John of the Ladder. A monk and abbot at the ancient monastery on Mount Sinai, St. John is best known for his spiritual work, The Ladder of Divine Ascent. This book outlines thirty "steps" or stages of spiritual growth, leading the soul to the Kingdom of God. Though written primarily for monks, its

wisdom has been embraced by Christians in all walks of life, even outside the monastery.

Interestingly, The Ladder does not contain a chapter specifically on evangelism or the Gospel. Does that mean there's nothing to learn from St. John on the topic? Not at all.

The absence of an "evangelism" step reflects the nature of monastic life. Monks and nuns typically stay within their monasteries, devoting themselves to prayer and asceticism, and do not evangelize in the conventional way—by going out into the world to preach. However, their life of prayer is

a powerful form of evangelism. Orthodox monastics spend, on average, eight hours a day in communal prayer, plus additional hours in personal prayer. Through these prayers, they support the Church and the world, often in unseen ways. Their intercessions soften hardened hearts, guide the lost, and protect the vulnerable.

In addition to their prayers, monastics offer us a lesson in the first "step" of The Ladder—"On Renunciation of the World." The Greek term aphtagis refers to "arranging oneself away from something," in this case, the world. Monastics have renounced the world; their black robes are a visible symbol of their separation. This renunciation is not just a personal choice; it is a public declaration that they no longer live for the world, but for God.

This renunciation is crucial not only for our own salvation but also for evangelism. When we invite others into the Church, we are asking them to leave the world behind. We cannot live simultaneously in both

the world and the Church. The Church is governed by a different set of values. If we bring the world's priorities into the Church—its demands, distractions, and secular principles—we lose the Church's distinctiveness, and evangelism becomes ineffective.

Monastics offer us a living example of what it means to renounce the world. Their choice to live a life separated from the world may not be the only path, but it gives us a tangible model of how to live for God

alone. We should treasure monasticism and encourage others, including our children, to see it as a desirable way of life. "Perhaps you will grow up to be a monk, son! We would all be blessed by that," we might say. But does renouncing the world mean retreating into a self-satisfied, exclusive club for the holy? Is it a rejection of the world and its people?

No, of course not. Just as Christ, Who is wholly "other" than the world, came into the world to save it, so too we are called to love the world through our renunciation. In fact, it is only by renouncing the world that we can truly love it. When we no longer need the world and are free from its de-

mands, we can act out of pure love. True love is not driven by obligation, but by freedom. When we are free, we offer a gift, not a transaction.

And there is no greater gift than bringing others to encounter Christ. This is the ultimate act of evangelism. By renouncing the world, we are not escaping from it, but loving it in the same way Christ does—by offering a way to eternal life, through the Church. Thus, we renounce the world not to avoid it, but to love it as God loves it. For God so loved the world that He gave His Son, and it is through our renunciation that we can share that love with others.

To our God, Who came into the world to save it, be all glory, honor, and worship, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen.







The Catechetical Sermon of St. John Chrysostom is read during Matins of Pascha.

If any man be devout and love God, let him enjoy this fair and radiant triumphal feast. If any man be a wise servant, let him rejoicing enter into the joy of his Lord. If any have labored long in fasting, let him now receive his recompense. If any have wrought from the first hour, let him today receive his just reward. If any have come at the third hour, let him with thankfulness keep the



feast. If any have arrived at the sixth hour, let him have no misgivings; because he shall in nowise be deprived thereof. If any have delayed until the ninth hour, let him draw near, fearing nothing. If any have tarried even until the eleventh hour, let him, also, be not alarmed at his tardiness; for the Lord, who is jealous of his honor, will accept the last even as the first; He gives rest unto him who comes at the eleventh hour, even as unto him who has wrought from the first hour.

And He shows mercy upon the last, and cares for the first; and to the one He gives, and upon the other He bestows gifts. And He both accepts the deeds, and welcomes the intention, and honors the acts and praises the offering. Wherefore, enter you all into the joy of your Lord; and receive your reward, both the first, and likewise the second. You rich and poor together, hold high festival. You sober and you heedless, honor the day. Rejoice today, both you who have fasted and you who have disregarded the fast. The table is full-laden; feast ye all sumptuously. The calf is fatted; let no one go hungry away.

Enjoy ye all the feast of faith: Receive ye all the riches of loving-kindness. let no one bewail his poverty, for the universal kingdom has been revealed. Let no one weep for his iniquities, for pardon has shown forth from the grave. Let no one fear death, for the Savior's death has set us free. He that was held prisoner of it has annihilated it. By descending into Hell, He made Hell captive. He embittered it when it tasted of His flesh. And Isaiah, foretelling this, did cry: Hell, said he, was embittered, when it encountered Thee in the lower regions. It was embittered, for it was abolished. It was embittered, for it was mocked. It was embittered, for it was slain. It was embittered, for it was overthrown. It was embittered, for it was fettered in chains. It took a body, and met God face to face. It took earth, and encountered Heaven. It took that which was seen, and fell upon the unseen.

O Death, where is your sting? O Hell, where is your victory? Christ is risen, and you are overthrown. Christ is risen, and the demons are fallen. Christ is risen, and the angels rejoice. Christ is risen, and life reigns. Christ is risen, and not one dead remains in the grave. For Christ, being risen from the dead, is become the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep. To Him be glory and dominion unto ages of ages. Amen.

HYMNS OF PASCHA

Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered, and let those who hate Him flee from before His face.

Today a sacred Pascha has been revealed to us; a Pascha new and holy, a Pascha mystical, a Pascha all-venerable, Pascha, the Redeemer Christ himself; a Pascha that is blameless, a Pascha that is great, a Pascha of believers, a Pascha that has opened for us the gates of Paradise, a Pascha that sanctifies believers all.

As smoke vanishes, so let them vanish, as wax melts before the fire.

Come now from that sight, O you women and heralds of good news, and say to Zion, "Receive from us the joyful tidings of the Resurrection of Christ. O Jerusalem, be exultant, dance and leap for joy, for you have witnessed Christ the King coming forth as a Bridegroom from the sepulcher."

So shall the sinners perish from the face of God. And let the righteous be glad.

The myrrh-bearing women at dawn very early, standing outside the tomb of the Giverof-Life, found an Angel who was seated upon the stone. And the Angel addressed them, and this is what he said, "Why do you seek among the dead the One who is alive? Why do you grieve as though corruptible the Incorrupt? So go back and proclaim it to His Disciples."

This is the day the Lord made; let us greatly rejoice and be glad therein.

Pascha of delight! Pascha, the Lord's Pascha! A Pascha all venerable has risen for us. Pascha! With joy let us embrace one another. Pascha, the ransom from sorrow! Today from the sepulcher Christ emerged resplendently as from a bridal chamber, and the women He filled with joy, saying, "Proclaim this to the Apostles."

It is the day of the Resurrection. Let us shine brightly for the festival, and also embrace one another. Brethren, let us say even to those who hate us, "Let us forgive everything for the Resurrection." And thus let us cry aloud, "Christ is risen from the dead, by death trampling down upon death, and to those in the tombs He has granted life."
