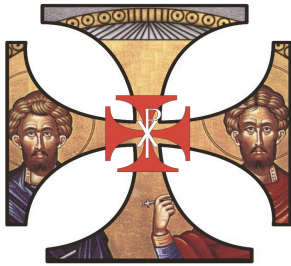

Applicants must be currently attending an accredited college, university or vocational program. This is a competitive scholarship based on need and merit with the award winner(s) to be selected upon recommendation by the Scholarship Committee. Requirements:

- Current Graduate students are eligible to apply.
- Applicant must be a son/daughter of a steward of St. Spyridon Greek Orthodox Church.
- A copy of **last semester's college transcript** with the school's official seal.
- **Two letters of recommendation** (may be from a professor, employer, internship/research adviser, volunteer groups)
- A resume that includes your **career objective, college activities, community activities, service,** and any **special honors or achievements** you have received while attending undergraduate or graduate school.
- Submit the following **essay** along with the application and all required documentation. The essay should be double spaced and at least 500 words and no more than 800 words in length.

Prompt: Discuss your involvement with Philoptochos or similar philanthropic groups and the lessons you've learned about charity and community service. How has this involvement emphasized the value of education in understanding and solving community issues? (500-800 words)

The St. Spyridon Philoptochos reserves the right to award more than one scholarship in the same academic year, based on required qualifications, grades, and service projects of the applicant.
