## FATHER'S LETTER

#### Dying to Self, Resurrecting with Christ

Historically, what the Romans did to Christ during Holy Week was quite common in that day. The Romans killed and crucified someone who disturbed their view and understanding of order. We see this to be true with both thieves at the right and left of Jesus Christ on the cross. Many Jews were killed while the Romans ruled over Judea. We know that Christ's crucifixion would present a different reality for all.

As a hymn of Holy Saturday beautifully proclaim:

Today Hades cried out groaning: "My power has been trampled on; the Shepherd has been crucified, and He raised up Adam; all those whom I swallowed in my strength I have disgorged. He Who was crucified has cleared the tombs and the power of Death avails not."

As we have now entered into Great Lent, we must not forget that we also have a role in this new reality! What exactly is this new reality? Can we present a false reality? Indeed it is possible to present a false reality. We can sometimes think that we are living holy lives when in fact, we are playing on the devil's playground.

When Jesus chastised in the Gospel, he often called them hypocrites. Many times the word hypocrite was used for those who practiced their piety in public places. We heard the parable of the publican and the pharisee during the beginning of the Triodion. When one draws attention to themselves; when one feels the need to be "seen" when they do good works or pray, they become hypocrites in the deepest way. They simply become actors instead of focusing on their heart and its relationship to God.

We easily start to criticize the Pharisees and think this doesn't apply to us. We can easily live our lives like they did. We see this in the world today. Social media experts put their acts of charity on-line for others to see. The very things that are designed to be done in secret and to make us humble can easily be used to make us more self-centered. One can easily give off the appearance of being holy, but this is a false reality. Unfortunately, many people – even churches – are in danger of falling into this practice! This is how we can easily live a false reality!

The lesson here is simple – humility is not something that is meant to be seen outwardly. One can easily give the appearance through their clothes and even through their demeanor, that they are humble. But the goal of humility is just the opposite. The goal of humility is to not stand out. It is to become like the humus – the earth or dirt – something we walk by and do not notice every day. Holiness and humility is to not stand out. Real holiness is to appear normal.

Perhaps we could say that Christ's crucifixion was like this. It appeared normal just like the others being crucified next to Him that day along with the many others who were crucified. We know, however, that within Christ and within the world, something very different was happening. Of course, His only motivation was to follow the will of His Father for the life of and resurrection of the entire world.

This is the way we should try to understand and view our spiritual life. God is to be our only audience, and we should not be so worried about what others are doing or even thinking. Externally we should look ordinary. Within we should be experiencing crucifixion of our passions and desires. Then our fast, our almsgiving and our prayer – when it is offered to God in complete humility and with no acknowledgement from others – truly fuels us in a way that only the grace from above can.

This is the real work of Great Lent, brothers and sisters. For the remaining days, let us do our very best to not bring attention to ourselves but do the real work of fasting, prayer and repentance. Let this be our battle. If we are serious about the spiritual struggle,

we will do what we do and draw no attention to ourselves.

This was something we experienced very much on the Holy Mountain. When we asked many of the monks to take a photo together, or if we asked them what they do day to day, they almost never wanted a photo and they quickly diverted the conversation back toward us and what we do for a living. Their primary care was to feed us and make us feel comfortable by offering us hospitality without asking us much of anything about how we fast, pray or give alms, and they never spoke about how they did these things either.

This is the exact opposite of being a hypocrite. The appearance seems ordinary, but holiness lies within, and it is intensely lived in every moment.

Let us, therefore, also offer our Lenten disciplines in this manner, brothers and sisters. Let us focus not on our false realities and our appearance but true humility and asceticism - the kind that our Lord emulates on the cross – the kind that appears ordinary on the outside but on the inside, is extraordinary. In this manner, we can experience true piety, crucifixion and ultimately, resurrection in our own life.

## Stewardship 2024

here was a man who took a shovel into his backyard each day to dig up a box containing money that he had buried in the ground. Every day he would look at it, count it, and then bury it again.

One day he dug in the usual spot and found that his box and the money were gone. He let out a cry, which brought his neighbor to ask what was the matter. Upon hearing what had happened, the neighbor asked, "What's all the fuss? You weren't using it anyway. Maybe the person who has it now will use it to do something good!"

In the Gospel of Matthew, we read the Parable of the Talents, in which a man leaving on a long journey called three of his servants and entrusted to each a certain sum of money measured in talents. To one he gave five, to another he gave two and to the third, he gave one talent. Upon his return, Deuteronomy (16:17) the man called his servants to give

account for the money with which he had entrusted them. The first two, by wise use of the money had doubled the amount they had received. To these he praised with the words, "Well done, good and faithful servant; you were faithful over a few things, I will make you ruler over many things. Enter into the joy of your lord."

The third servant, who had received one talent, out of fear, had buried the talent in the ground. Upon the man's return, this servant returned to him only the one talent. In anger, the man called him a "wicked and lazy servant," and taking away the one talent, he gave it to the servant who had ten. Jesus gave us this parable for us to consider the gifts that God has given us. Although we all receive different gifts, there is no difference in God's reward for what we accomplish with them. If you want to be a faithful servant, then take whatever you have and offer it faithfully to the Lord. It is not about how much ability you have, it is what you do with it.

The gifts we receive are to be multiplied. They are not to be buried in the ground. About this, Saint Gregory the Great wrote that hiding our talent in the earth, is to use our gifts only for earthly things.

ent referred to substantial amount of money. The message to us today is that God gives each of us something of considerable value and expects good stewardship and a return on what He has

given. Although Jesus speaks to us about money in the Parable of the Talents, He is really talking about something far more important.

Whatever blessings we receive, we are to multiply them. We were given our church - our local parish - built by our ancestors and all who have gone before us. We are to grow it - to multiply it - by adding to the number of faithful and growing her ministries. In the Old Testament book of Deuteronomy (16:17), we read, "Every man shall give as he is able, according to the blessing of the Lord thy God which He hath given thee." When we cling tightly to our wealth, we are like the man, when forced to swim from a sinking ship, couldn't bear to leave his money behind. He strapped his gold to his body, but as he swam toward shore, the weight of the gold pulled him under and he drowned. Do we own our money or does our money own us?

God gave us his love - do we multiply it or do we keep it for ourselves?

God gave us the Gospel - do we multiply it or do we keep it for ourselves?

God gave us the Church - do we multiply it or do we keep it for ourselves?

Our gift to God and His Church is a sacred act, a form of worship, and a response to all his blessings in our life -- our bodies, our family, the environment, our time, our faith, our neighbor.

Stewardship is our spirituality in action, our faith in action, our theology in action.

Stewardship is personal - between Jesus and us - an expression of love and commitment. A response to all that he has given us.

Some day we will stand before God and show Him what we did with all that He entrusted to us. If we have been faithful stewards of our gifts, He will say to us, "Well done, good and faithful servant. Enter into the joy of your Lord."

APRIL 15

HOLY MARTYR SABBAS THE GOTH (372) IN THE KINGDOM OF WALLACHIA (IN MODERN-DAY ROMANIA) THE GOTHS

UNDERTOOK A BRUTAL PERSECUTION OF CHRISTIANS. A GOTHIC PRINCE CAME TO THE VILLAGE OF BUZAU AND ASKED THE VILLAGERS IF ANY

CHRISTIANS LIVED THERE. THEY SWORE TO HIM THAT THERE WERE NONE. AT THIS, SABBAS CAME BEFORE THE PRINCE AND SAID 'LET NO ONE SWEAR AN OATH ON MY BEHALF. I AM A CHRISTIAN.' TOUCHED BY HIS

COURAGE, THE PRINCE LET SABBAS GO, SAYING 'THIS ONE CAN DO NEITHER HARM NOR GOOD.' THE FOLLOWING YEAR A PRIEST NAMED SANSAL CAME TO THE VILLAGE AND CELEBRATED PASCHA WITH SABBAS (WHO WAS TRULY THE ONLY CHRISTIAN THERE). WHEN THE PAGANS HEARD OF THIS, THEY ATTACKED SABBAS' HOUSE AND SEIZED BOTH MEN. THEY DRAGGED SABBAS NAKED THROUGH THORNS, THEN TIED BOTH HIM AND SANSAL TO TREES AND

TRIED TO MAKE THEM EAT MEAT OFFERED TO IDOLS. NEITHER MAN

WOULD TOUCH THE SACRIFICES. THE PRINCE THEN SENTENCED SABBAS TO DEATH AND GAVE HIM OVER TO THE SOLDIERS. SABBAS WALKED TO THE PLACE OF EXECUTION JOYFULLY, SINGING AND PRAISING GOD.

SEEING HIS GOODNESS, THE SOLDIERS TRIED TO FREE HIM ON THE WAY, BUT SABBAS REFUSED, TELLING THEM THAT IT WAS THEIR DUTY TO CARRY OUT THE PRINCE'S COMMAND. THE SOLDIERS TOOK HIM TO A RIVER. TIED A ROCK TO HIS NECK AND

#### Saint John Chrysostom Oratorical and Fine Arts Festival



### **GREAT LENT**

#### **Preparation for Holy Confession**

The gift of God's forgiveness is received through private prayer, corporate worship, the disciplines of prayer and fasting, penitential services and above all through the sacrament of Holy Confession. The value of Holy Confession is twofold. First, through this sacramental act of the ordained priest and the Christian believer we have the assurance of divine forgiveness, according to the words of Christ (Jn 20:23). Secondly, Holy Confession provides the opportunity to talk about one's deep concerns, to receive counsel and to be encouraged toward spiritual growth, all of which are universally recognized as extremely beneficial to personal life.

Holy Confession is appropriate at least twice a year and more often if an Orthodox Christian feels the need for it. It is also a part of our total spiritual preparation during the fast periods leading up to the great feasts of Pascha,

Christmas, the Falling Asleep of the Theotokos and the Feast of Twelve Apostles. However, Holy Confession is especially necessary: when a serious sin has been committed; when a habitual sin has overwhelmed a Christian, or when a Christian has stopped growing spiritually and needs a reexamination of priorities. We confess our sins to God and the power of for-

giveness is God's. However, the gift of God's forgiveness, although assured, is not magical. It does not automatically spare us from spiritual struggle - the continual vigilance against evil and the unceasing warfare against sin. Holy Confession will bear fruits in the Spirit only when the believer hates evil, utterly rejects sin and patiently cultivates positive habits of the life in Christ.

How can one prepare for Holy Confession? Preparation for Holy Confession is a prayerful examination of thoughts, words, acts, attitudes, habits, values, priorities, goals, direction and way of life. This prayerful selfexamination includes not only the personal religious life, but also family relationships, social activities, job conduct, business dealings, political commitments and even recreational pursuits, because our entire existence should be lived in under the light of the Holy Spirit is not to condemn ourselves, but to affirm our true selves in Christ who has given us access to God's mercy and forgiveness and who has taught us to live for God's glory.

Please remember that Holy Confession is not a counseling session. If you wish to speak about general concerns and challenges please schedule an appointment to see the priest at his office outside of the times for confession. Holy Confession is a sacrament in which we are ready and prepared to express our sins. We should prayerfully prepare to receive the sacrament by thinking of what we will say before we come. It is often helpful to write down our confession so that we do not forget our list at the time of

Confession. Finally, Holy Confession involves <u>our</u> sins. There is no need to speak of the sins of others or to contextualize our sins within the sins and imperfections of others. God is aware of our circumstances. There is no need to justify or lighten our sins in the sight of God. He already knows and He will forgive us according to the measure that we have forgiven others. Our Confession is the seal of His forgiveness which is promised to those who repent through the commission given to the Church by Christ Himself.

#### "So Jesus said to them again,

"Peace to you! As the Father has sent Me, I also send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." (John 20:21-23)

#### Prayer, Fasting & Charity

During Great Lent, our Orthodox Church calls us to renew our discipline of prayer, fasting, and charity. Private prayer must accompany all the church services. The fasting rules during Lent are as follows: On weekdays and Holy Saturday, meat, fish, dairy products, wine and oil are not allowed, with the exception of March 25th


when fish, wine, and oil are allowed. On Saturday and Sunday, oil and wine are allowed, with the exception of Palm Sunday when fish is also allowed. Finally, in order for prayer and fasting to be meaningful and spiritually beneficial, they need to be accompanied by vigilance, abstinence, forgiveness, charity, and acts of compassion.


