FATHER'S LETTER

"Let us Pray for the Peace of the World"

In the time of Christ, wars and tribulations were prevalent resulting from sin. In a time when people worshipped the sun, the moon, and different elements of the earth, the pagan world did not know where to turn and what or who to worship. The world was forced to direct its attention to multiple gods and multiple elements never knowing or seeing the face of these so-called "gods."

The time was right, and ever so needed, for there to be a change. People yearned for peace and a new way of life -- a new way of thinking, a new way of loving that would have a lasting impact. And that change would come through the birth of our Savior.

Imagine the peace that this brought the world. The birth of Christ allows God to be visible for the first time! God to be touched – God to be Emmanuel – God to be with us! No longer did the world have to be inundated with fear from multiple gods. The one true God comes to be with us so we may direct our attention toward one person – the Prince of Peace.

The Lord in His birth is born in a cave shaded in darkness. Wrapped in linen cloths as if preparing for burial, the icon of the Nativity foreshadows the ultimate purpose of the Nativity, which is that Christ is born to die. But his death brings resurrection. This supreme act, Christ becoming man, was sparked by God, and grants us the peace that we are no longer to fear death.

The Christ child was born into a universe broken by sin and into a world that was torn by hatred. He begins to reconcile everything to himself and brings peace to the world. We see this in the icon of the Nativity. Within this image, angels converse with humans, shepherds worship with kings, Jews and Gentiles gather together, man and beast kneel side by side in adoration.

The Virgin mother looks on with love, and everywhere there is peace, good will, unity of heart and purpose. At the manger, all are welcomed and all are reconciled.


It's no wonder that when Christ rose from the dead, the apostles did not recognize Him; the message that Christ gave to them – the first thing he said to them was "peace be to you." It was only with peace from above that they could recognize Christ resurrected.

We are reminded countless times in the liturgy to pray for peace. In peace let us pray to the lord, for the peace from above, for peace in the whole world. Several times the priest blesses, turns to the people, and says, "Peace be to all."

As much of the world continues to be divided through war and tribulation, let us fervently pray these petitions of peace when we attend worship. We are blessed to live peacefully in the United States. Pray that all nations and their leaders make decisions that lead toward peace. Protect these countries, O Lord, and our country from conflict and war, and pray that He helps put away mistrust, hatred, and bitterness. Pray for peace so the Light of Christ may shine in areas of which are currently experiencing darkness.

During this Christmas season, as we continue to celebrate His birth for 12 days after His Nativity, may we also acquire this peace so that others may witness the birth of our Lord in our hearts. It is this love and peace that transforms and transfigures our homes and families, our parish and all the world. Then heaven and earth can be restored and we will be able to give glory to God in the highest. Christ is Born! Glorify Him!

SAINT STORY OF THE MONTH



JANUARY 12

HOLY MARTYR TATIANA (~230)

SHE WAS THE DAUGHTER OF A WEALTHY ROMAN CONSUL. SHE BECAME A DEACONESS IN ROME, AND WAS SEIZED AS A CHRISTIAN DURING THE REIGN OF ALEXANDER SEVERUS. BEFORE THE TRIBUNAL SHE FEARLESSLY CONFESSED CHRIST AND, WHEN SHE WAS TAKEN TO THE TEMPLE IN AN EFFORT TO FORCE HER TO MAKE SACRIFICE, SHE CAST DOWN THE IDOLS BY THE POWER OF HER PRAYER. AT THIS, THE SOLDIERS SEIZED HER AND SUBJECTED HER TO MANY INDIGNITIES AND TORTURES, FINALLY THROWING HER INTO A RAGING FURNACE. WHEN THIS DID NOT HARM HER, SHE WAS THROWN TO THE WILD BEASTS, BUT THEY REFUSED TO HARM HER. AT LAST SHE WAS BEHEADED AND THUS GAINED HER CROWN.

JANUARY 16

† VENERATION OF THE PRECIOUS CHAINS OF THE HOLY AND GLORIOUS APOSTLE PETER.

THE STORY OF ST PETER'S IMPRISONMENT AND MIRACULOUS RELEASE BY AN ANGEL OF GOD IS TOLD IN ACTS CH. 12. THE CHAINS WHICH FELL FROM HIS HANDS WERE COLLECTED BY CHRISTIANS AND PASSED DOWN THROUGH THE GENERATIONS AS PRECIOUS RELICS, FINALLY COMING TO CONSTANTINOPLE FROM AND BEING PLACED IN THE CHURCH OF ST PETER, WHERE THEY WORKED MANY MIRACLES AND HEALINGS.

THERE IS NOTHING SUPERSTITIOUS ABOUT THE VENERATION OF CLOTHING AND OTHER OBJECTS BELONGING TO THE SAINTS: THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES DESCRIBES HOW HANDKERCHIEFS OR APRONS THAT HAD TOUCHED THE APOSTLE PAUL WOULD HEAL THE SICK (CH. 19), AND THAT EVEN THE SHADOW OF THE APOSTLE PETER HEALED THOSE ON WHOM IT FELL (CH. 5). IN THE TWENTIETH CENTURY, A SHIRT WORN BY ST NEKTARIOS ON HIS DEATH-BED HEALED A PARALYZED MAN. THE SANCTITY OF THOSE UNITED TO GOD EXTENDS NOT ONLY TO THEIR BODIES BUT AT TIMES TO THEIR GARMENTS.
