### FATHER'S ARTICLE

In the time of Christ, the wars and tribulations were all a cause of sin. In a time when people worshipped the sun, the moon, and different elements of the earth, the pagan world did not know where to turn and what or who to worship. The world was forced to direct its attention to multiple gods and multiple elements never knowing or seeing the face of these so-called "gods."

The time was right, and ever so needed, for there to be a change. People yearned for peace and a new way of life -- a new way of thinking, a new way of loving that would have a lasting impact. And that change would come through the birth of our Savior.

Imagine the peace that this brought the world. The birth of Christ allows God to be visible for the first time. God to be touched – God to be Emmanuel – God to be with us! No longer did the world have to be inundated with fear from multiple gods. The one true God comes to be with us so we may direct our attention toward one person – the Prince of Peace.

The Lord in His birth is born in a cave shaded in darkness. Wrapped in linen cloths as if preparing for burial, the icon of the Nativity foreshadows the ultimate purpose of the Nativity, which is that Christ is born to die. But his death brings resurrection. This supreme act, Christ becoming man, was sparked by God, and grants us the peace that we are no longer to fear death.

The Christ child was born into a universe broken by sin and into a world that was torn by hatred. He begins to reconcile everything to himself and brings peace to the world. We see this in the icon of the nativity. Archbishop Elpidophoros of America shared the following in His Message to the orthodox faithful:

Angels converse with humans, Shepherds worship with kings Jews and gentiles gather together Man and beast kneel side by side in adoration.

The virgin mother looks on with love, and everywhere there is peace, good will, unity of heart and purpose. At the manger, all are welcomed and all are reconciled.

It's no wonder that when Christ rose from the dead, the apostles did not recognize Him; the message that Christ gave to them – the first thing he said to them was "peace be to you." It was only with peace from above that they could recognize Christ resurrected.

We are reminded countless times in the liturgy to pray for peace. In peace let us pray to the Lord, for the peace from above, for peace in the whole world. Several times the priest blesses, turns to the people, and says, "Peace be to all."

During this Christmas season, as we will continue to celebrate His birth for 12 days, may we also acquire this peace so that others may witness the birth of our Lord in our hearts. It is this love and peace that transforms and transfigures our homes and families, our parish and all the world. Then heaven and earth can be restored and we will be able to give glory to God in the highest.

On behalf of our staff, the Parish Council and the St. Spyridon community, we wish you a joyful and blessed Christmas and a Happy, Prosperous and Holy New Year!



# Our Church Our Spiritual Home



Parish Family of St. Spyridon,

As we begin a New Year together, we ask that you prayerfully consider how you might be able to support the ministries of St. Spyridon. Please take the time to consider the following information:

\*Time and Talent—The volunteer hours that are needed to run our parish total about 21,500 hours annually. Split evenly, this would be about 63 hours annually per family unit (about 1.2 hours per week per family unit). What talent has God blessed you with that you can offer the church 1.2 hours per week? Are you a teacher? Do you enjoy working with youth? Are you handy? Do you enjoy outreach? Please indicate your interest, talent or skill you would like to offer on our stewardship card.

\*Treasure — The direct financial cost of our spiritual home (without collections from candles and trays) is about \$294,000 per year. Instead of relying on fundraisers to offer ministries and programs, imagine how we could focus our energy and time more on His service if we properly care for our Spiritual Home. This can be accomplished if each household (about 350 families) could offer \$840 per year (equivalent to \$70 per monthcomparable to our cable or cell phone bill!).

\* Worship and Sacramental Life — God wants us to be good stewards with the hunger to serve, desire to give, and passion to please Him. Coming to worship and participating in the sacramental life sanctifies our soul and body so that we may contribute to the sanctification of the world. This is the greatest form of stewardship!

Once again, we thank our donors for their generosity! The contributions of food and money enabled us to assemble and donate (35) Christmas Food Baskets to needy families throughout our community. Each basket contained a ham and enough fresh and nonperishable food items for multiple meals (potatoes, celery, carrots, onions, fresh fruit, pancake mix & syrup, vegetable oil, flour, sugar, salad dressing, tomato sauce, mac & cheese, brownie mix, canned corn, beans and peas, salt, pepper, fruit pie, frozen vegetables, rolls, salami, butter, rice, chicken soup, chicken stock, stuffing and gravy.)

As part of our ongoing partnership with Kingdom Word Church in Roseland (formerly St. Spyridon), we were able to donate (50) hams, mashed potatoes, gravy, canned corn, and corn muffin mix to supplement what they were distributing to their families for Christmas. We usually deliver our food donation to the church, with the help of Bobby Papadatos. This time, Reverend Duncan and his brother were able to come to us. It was their first visit to St. Spyridon, so we offered them a tour of our church. They were both visibly moved by the beauty of our iconography, as well as the icons and cornerstone from the old church. Our next holiday distribution will be for Easter. If you know of a family in need, we distribute food every Thursday from 1pm - 2pm in the back entrance of the Gym. Wishing everyone a Happy & Healthy New Year!

In total we were able to donate over \$18,000 to serve the needs of Saint Spyridon and other Orthodox charities including the IOCC, fires in Greece and mission in South America. We also reached out to our extended community and donated nearly \$6,000 to children in need, the homeless and operation classroom. We are looking forward to continuing our outreach and to support our community in the upcoming year.

During the month of December, we successfully held our annual Craft Show. It was lovely to have our community back together again. Thank you for all the ladies and parish members who volunteered, cooked, baked and coordinated together in comradery. The baking also continued in December for our "philo bags" which were delivered to our shut-ins before Christmas, thank you to all the ladies who baked and delivered them with our Christmas greetings. We cannot forget those who are part of our family but are limited due to illness or age. Last year the Malfas ladies decorated beautiful Christmas trees which were delivered to our shut ins. This year the circumstances changed and Philoptochos presented Angela Malfas with a Christmas tree made by one of our younger members. Stephanie Sotiropoulos made a special tree where Angela was able to open a cup ever day in December thru Christmas. Inside there was an inspirational hand written saying and an associated gift donated by the Philoptochos members and PTA. As we have done in the past you can preorder avgolemono soup, lagana and dessert to pick up and take home. Please look for details in the coming weeks. We hope you will again support this fundraiser as ½ of the proceeds with be given to the Hellenic Association, a NFP organization assisting our Greek community. We chose this organization because of a recent event. There was a death of a gentlemen with no direct family and the Hellenic Association stepped in to find family and to make the arrangements for his funeral. This gentleman was part of our St. Spyridon community as his father had served as a priest of our parish many years ago.




