### FATHER'S LETTER

#### Handling Conflict: Staying on the Path Toward Salvation (sermon delivered Sunday, May 28th, 2023)

If you grew up on a farm, then you'd know that everyone has to pitch in to make things work. My friend's mom was asked by her husband to drive a tractor across a field. She had never done this before, and her husband said to her "Pick out an object at the end of the field and drive toward it, that way your path will remain straight."

So she put the tractor in gear and off she went toward the other end of the field. It wasn't long before she noticed her husband running alongside the tractor waving his hands up in the air trying to get her attention. She stopped and asked, "What's wrong?"

She then noticed that the path she created with the tractor was rather crooked as opposed to the straight line she needed to drive. Her husband again explained she needed to pick out an object and drive toward it. She said, "I did!"

"What are you driving toward?" he asked. She pointed to the object at the end of the row, which at that point she realized was a bird that had been hopping across the ground.

Precious friends, how important it is to be careful when setting our mark so that we set it on something that is stationary.

Today, the church celebrates the Fathers of the 1st Ecumenical Council, and the hymns today describes these men as "radiant stars, the myrrh breathing flowers of paradise, the all-gold mouths of the Word, the Church's pride, the adornment of the universe." In 325 A.D., Saint Constantine and the church organized this gathering to discuss important foundational truths of faith and resolve any divisive issues to ensure continued unity amongst the faithful. Amongst these 318 bishops summoned worldwide were Saint Athanasios, our very own St. Spyridon and St. Nicholas, along with many other Saints and Hierarchs. Within this Council was discussed the observance of the date of Pascha, and the construction of the first half of the Nicene Creed: "I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth"... ending at the point where it mentions the Holy Spirit.

The Creed is our statement of faith. If anyone asks you, "what does Orthodox Christianity believe", it can be summarized by the creed that we recite at every Divine Liturgy. In the time of this council, a man named Arius had deviated from the teachings of the church. He had inserted his own opinion about who Christ is.

Arius taught that Jesus is not truly divine but is a created being; that he came into existence when he entered the world. We believe that Jesus is co-eternal with the Father, and Arius taught that Jesus is not of the same essence with the Father – In other words, he taught that Jesus is finite and therefore, devalues and demotes Him in comparison to God the Father. The Creed in 325 at the 1st Ecumenical Council is a direct response to Arius - that Jesus Christ is "begotten of the Father before all ages, light of light true God of true

God, begotten, not created, of one essence with the Father by Whom all things were made."

Society and political agendas change, but our faith has been that one thing that remains constant. This is true because "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and tomorrow" (Hebrews 13:8). Yes, there were challenges along the way. These ecumenical councils, led by the Holy Spirit, helped resolve whatever conflicts the church had to confront throughout the centuries and maintain its unity amongst believers.

So, like the Arian controversy, when we have controversies or struggles that arise within our lives, our homes or our parish, what do we do? How are we called to handle them?

First, we have to remember that there's a reason we call each other brothers and sisters. The words "brother" and "sister" implies that we are to have a higher level of intimacy with one another. Our connection should be so close that we consider each other blood brothers or sisters. This alone should set a healthy perspective for how we should interact with each other.

If we care about our spiritual life and theirs, we also will refrain from receiving Holy Communion with God until we are in communion with our brother or sister. When one reads Matthew 5:24 – first go and reconcile with them before you offer your gift – implies that importance of reconciliation.

Most importantly, me must do our best to reconcile with the other and have peace with them. So we take the opportunity to talk to the other and understand their point of view. We don't embarrass. We don't criticize. We don't respond with anger, but we do dialogue with love. If we respond w/ anger, all we will hear is anger. If we

speak out of pain, this will only spread pain. If we speak out of care and compassion for your brother or sister in Christ, it will yield results of peace – the result we are looking for as does Christ.

So what do if that doesn't work? Then have witnesses – those who can attest to the problem-- witnesses who see the interaction and the damage that it creates—and take two or three people to help. If this doesn't work, we take it to the church community, and we confess to the father of the community.

We try everything to make forgiveness and reconciliation possible. This way we can make sure that each and everyone of us are on the path to the kingdom.

Is this not what we want for all of our brothers and sisters? When we aim for peace, we can know that we are following Christ. If there is not peace amongst a person, people or even within an organization, we are following not Christ, but perhaps our own ego or the devil himself. For God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble (James 4:6).

In Sunday's gospel Christ prays to his Father "to keep them in your name, that they may be one even as we are one" (John 17:11). Christ calls for us – in our homes, our families, our church – to be united. When we teach, preach and follow Jesus, wherever we may be,

this is what will bring unity. Let us always use Christ and His teachings as our marker, to determine if what we do is what He would do in all circumstances.




### **GOLF OUTING**


