FATHER'S LETTER

PRUNING OUR LIVES

Parish Family of Saint Spyridon,

I am thankful for the efforts of my parents who have taught me the art of gardening. Every year, my parents have helped me plant the garden in our backyard and we have reaped the benefits of caring for our plants.

I used to feel intimidated by our garden not knowing exactly how to care for it. If you have a green thumb, you will understand that pruning leads to new growth and continued blooming. When I trimmed some dead branches and diseased leaves, I learned quickly that this opens the center of the plant to light and air circulation. Within a few days, I was amazed that new branches were stretching outward and the leaves were beginning to look greener. Interestingly enough, the bush needed a "wound" in order to get stronger.

The spiritual life is the same. Our holy scripture mentions many references to planting and reaping, pruning, uprooting and weeding. What comes to mind is John 15: "I am the true vine and My Father is the vinedresser. Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit."

Our Heavenly Father knows what is dead inside us, what is diseased and what is threatening to cause stunted growth. The sacrament of confession helps our confessor understand what we need for spiritual cleansing which opens our center to light. Yes, pruning can be uncomfortable, but when carried out consistently, we also begin to grow.

Many of us are reluctant to change. Most of us are creatures of habit and we easily can follow the motto "keep it the same." But our Lord wants us to make some healthy changes in our lives. Perhaps we are not getting enough air circulation and light. Perhaps the Lord is encouraging you to get out of your comfort zone and do something out of the or-

dinary. Maybe the Lord wants you to eliminate something from your life and maybe he wants you to focus on something fruitful and pleasing to God.

It is important for us to get out of our comfort zone and prune our old ways. This may be what we need to get the stifled air of stagnancy moving again so that we can start to breathe in a new and fresh experience. This way, "keep it the same" or "we've always done it this way" can be words that blossom into a solution that could actually benefit us, our families, and our parishes. What is important to remember is that it takes time for anything to bear fruit. One will not see the fruit or "blossoms" that are growing initially, but they will come.

With the beginning of the fast of the Holy Apostles and also the Dormition of the Theotokos fast, it may be a good time to reorient our lives and schedule a time for soulpruning. Schedule a confession so that you can break the monotony of your schedule. Do something new together as a family or present some ideas for your church and get involved so that it may benefit the Lord's ministry and bring salvation to others. It might seem hard or painful at first, and we might even make some mistakes. In time, however, the unhealthy branches will be removed and the flowers will begin to blossom and give glory to our Creator. Whatever it may be, let us make sure that it is done in humility, love and for our betterment and the benefit of our family and parish community.
