Dear St. Spyridon Parish Family,

George guiding us and inspiring us, through the intercessions of our beloved Patron Saint Spyridon, to experience and participate in the many beautiful holy services and sacraments. FATHER'S LETTER

Parish Family of Saint Spyridon,

Christ is Risen! Χριστός Ανέστη!

What a blessing it was to share our first Holy Pascha together! I was deeply moved by the beautiful chanting, the participation of our altar boys and myrophores, and the offering of time that many people shared to clean and help execute our beautiful services throughout the week.

On Holy Pascha, as we sat in darkness and waited in great anticipation for the reception of His light, I found myself contemplating the love of God for all of us. God became flesh on earth so that one day we could have the opportunity to live in the Kingdom. God sacrificed himself here on earth so that we could live forever in the Kingdom of heaven.

What a beautiful display of love! God gives us this amazing gift, and he displays it throughout Holy Week. The great gift of God's love is offered to us so that we may also share the love and joy of the Resurrection with the world!

Saint Paul writes in Ephesians 5:8: "You are in darkness but now I need you to walk as children of light." When our church is dark on Holy Pascha, it symbolizes our old ways – our life without Christ. We have now received the light and now Saint Paul wants us to walk as Children of light.

How do we walk as Children of Light?

First, we make the choice to give God ALL of who we are because He gave us all of Himself. This saving act took place to "trample upon death," but the evil one still works.

One of the greatest things that the devil uses against us is distraction. He distracts in many ways by whispering in our ear, "I work six days a week, I can't make it to church on Sunday" or "God knows I love Him – I don't need to be in church on Sunday" or "I love God – he knows I was at Holy Pascha – that's enough for me." Brothers and sisters, these are all distractions to continue living in darkness and not walk as Children constantly bearing His light.

God doesn't want to be our "Easter God." He wants us to be our "everyday God." I want to encourage everyone reading this article to make God your every-day God. Make God a "non-negotiable" in your life. If we are truly going to celebrate Holy Pascha every day, why don't we make a declaration that every single day we are going to give fifteen minutes to Him? Spend five minutes every single day reading the scriptures and something inspirational that will fill you with His light and love!

Second, God wants us to serve others as He first served us. On judgment day God is going to ask us, "What did you do with my Christ? What did you do with that Holy Resurrection service that I gave you? What did you do with the light that I gave you on Holy Pascha?"

God wants us to share the blessing of life. The value of our lives is not what you get – it is who you serve in this world. Let us be sincere to live our best here on earth so that we can live with Him in the kingdom! Let us go "all in" with God because he went "all in" with us. Let us serve Him by serving others in this world! I want to encourage you to get involved, keep growing and let God be your every-day God! In this way, Holy Pascha does not become a one-day event in our life, but an invitation to change our life and live for Him every day!

Truly He is Risen!






