FATHER'S LETTER

TRUE FORGIVENESS

"I'll forgive, but I will never forget!" We hear this often and think we have done our part if we get to this point. But what exactly is going on in our hearts?

The Christian Is called to forgive in a much deeper way than just saying "it's okay" when we are told "I'm sorry." Certainly, it is more than acting like everything is okay without having resolved the problem. This is avoidance, not forgiveness.

Forgiveness is the watchword of the Christian life. We cannot be Christians without forgiveness. We are slowly approaching the Christmas fast which will begin on November 15. Soon enough, we will come to experience the birth of Jesus Christ only to see Him wrapped in swaddling clothes and laying in a manger. He is wrapped appearing as if He is in a burial shroud revealing that Christ is born to die. Christ's death on the cross exemplifies how we should forgive as Christ did on the cross "Forgive for they know not what they do." This kind of forgiveness - unconditional, radical forgiveness and love - is this humanly possible?

Yes, over and over again, Jesus taught a radical form of forgiveness. But He didn't just talk about it. He practiced it. He forgave all of us – the ones who crucified Him and continue to do so today. And yes, he expected this from His disciples just as He calls us to this same forgiveness here in 2023 AD.

We might be thinking, "Ok Father, but I'm human. I'm not perfect like God. I can't be expected to forgive in this manner." Yet we believe as Orthodox Christians that God became human so that we could become like Him (St. Athanasios). Our Lord did not become incarnate to simply be a teacher or activist. He came to make it possible for us to return to Paradise, and the return to Paradise begins in this life. This journey begins with forgiveness.

In the Lord's prayer, He invites us to ask God to "forgive us our trespasses s we forgive those who trespass against us." Afterwards, He goes on to say, "If you forgive others their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you, but if you don't forgive others their trespasses, neither with your Father forgive your trespasses" (Matthew 6:14-15) So God forgives us, but it depends on our attitude of forgiveness toward others.

It's easy to hold on to our hurt or anger when we are harmed. We may refuse to forgive or wait until the other person comes forward. But what good comes from resentment? We are tempted many

times to forgive when someone has "proven" they are sorry like it's some sort of legal pardon that we grant when we feel they are ready.

On the contrary, we have done nothing to deserve God's forgiveness, and yet He died for s. We can't repay such a debt. If we realize that God's forgiveness is a great gift that we didn't earn or can't repay, then why do we expect that from others? Forgiveness is a gift we giving without expecting anything in return. This is the spirit of correct giftgiving. Don't expect anything in return.

Resentment locks us in the chains of a heavy weight that is difficult to carry. It eats away at us and we become bitter, angry and unhappy. It takes away our joy as we begin to live our lives as victims. In Christ, we are not victims but conquerors and sharers in the death and resurrection of Christ. Therefore, we must rise with Him and follow His example of forgiveness! When we forgive, we open our hearts to love. If we are prepared to forgive, then we will also be prepared and quicker to ask forgiveness also.

As the Christmas fast will soon begin on November 15, let us contemplate the Gift of eternal life that begins with the birth of Jesus Christ. Have the humility to ask someone to forgive you. It is very rare that the person who is offended does nothing wrong. Be introspective, be aware of your thoughts, attitudes, and your words. We can't change the past, but we can learn from it and live better now.

Forgiveness is more than words; it is an attitude and a way of living out our Christian life. Do you struggle with resentment? Does your pride or fear of getting hurt keep you from forgiving? Now is the time to forgive and prepare for paradise. Now is the time – "Blessed is the Kingdom of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit!" This Kingdom, beloved faithful, is here and now.



The forty day fast for the feast of the Nativity begins Wednesday,

November 15th. According to the Church canons, fish, wine and oil are allowed until December 17th, except for Wednesdays and Fridays. Strict fast is observed from December 18th to the 24th.

This year, we will once again celebrate the 'Saranta-leitourgo', forty Liturgies during the Christmas Fast. It is a custom of the Orthodox Church to celebrate forty consecutive liturgies leading up to Christmas Day.

PTA NEWSLETT

FOREFEAST OF THE ENTRY OF THE MOST HOLY THEOTOKOS INTO THE **TEMPLE. OUR HOLY FATHER GREGORY OF DECAPOLIS (842)** HE WAS BORN IN IRENOPOLIS, ONE OF THE "TEN CITIES" OF ASIA MINOR. THOUGH HIS PARENTS WANTED HIM TO MARRY, HE ENTERED MONASTIC LIFE AS A YOUNG MAN, AND STRUGGLED FOR MANY YEARS, LIVING IN RECLUSION UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF A WISE SPIRITUAL FATHER. ONE DAY.

WHILE IN PRAYER, HE WAS CARRIED AWAY TO PARADISE AND EXPERIENCED THE BLESSEDNESS THAT THE REDEEMED WILL KNOW AT THE GENERAL RESURRECTION. THE VISION SEEMED TO HIM ONLY TO LAST FOR AN HOUR, BUT HE LEARNED FROM HIS DISCIPLE THAT HE HAD BEEN IN ECSTASY FOR FOUR DAYS. AWARE THAT THE ENEMY CAN APPEAR AS AN ANGEL OF LIGHT, AND THAT WE SHOULD BE SUSPICIOUS OF SEEMING **REVELATIONS, HE SOUGHT THE COUNSEL OF HIS ABBOT, WHO REASSURED** HIM, AND TOLD HIM TO GIVE THANKS TO GOD BY CONTINUING IN HIS ASCETIC LABORS. SOON, HE WAS TOLD BY REVELATION THAT HE WAS TO GO FORTH INTO THE WORLD, LIVING WITHOUT AN EARTHLY HOME, TO UPHOLD THE ORTHODOX FAITH, WHICH WAS THEN UNDER ATTACK BY THE ICONOCLASTS, HE TRAVELED THROUGH EPHESUS, CONSTANTINOPLE, CORINTH, ROME, SICILY, THESSALONICA, AND CONSTANTINOPLE AGAIN, LABORING IN DEFENSE OF THE FAITH AND WORKING MANY MIRACLES. USUALLY HE WOULD STAY WITH POOR PEOPLE WHO WELCOMED HIM INTO THEIR HOUSES, THOUGH IT WAS FORBIDDEN BY LAW TO RECEIVE AN ORTHODOX MONK (THAT IS, ONE WHO DEFENDED THE ICONS). IN HIS LAST FEW YEARS, AFFLICTED BY ILLNESS, HE SETTLED IN CONSTANTINOPLE, WHERE HE REPOSED IN PEACE IN 832, JUST BEFORE THE END OF ICONOCLASM AND THE RESTORATION OF ORTHODOXY. SINCE 1490, HIS **INCORRUPT RELICS HAVE DWELT AT THE MONASTERY OF BISTRITSA IN** ROMANIA, WHERE THEY CONTINUE TO BE A SOURCE OF MIRACLES FOR THE MANY PILGRIMS WHO COME TO VENERATE THEM.
